Aircraft Accident Victim and Family Assistances In Indonesia

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The presentation is based on experiences on the handling of family assistance on three catastrophic accidents since 2014.

Indonesia family assistance

- Currently, Indonesia has not established a system in providing assistance to transportation accident victims and their families;
- Several government agencies are involve, including;
 - 1. Search and Rescue Agency \rightarrow provided the information of search progress;
 - 2. Ministry of Health \rightarrow counselling;
 - 3. Ministry of Foreign Affairs \rightarrow Immigration and customs formalities;
 - 4. Police \rightarrow victims identifications;
 - 5. Ministry of Transportation;
 - 6. Aircraft operator;
 - 7. Airport operator, and
 - 8. others;

Indonesia family assistance

• The distribution of responsibilities has been agreed while KNKT will act as Accredited Representative and Ministry of Foreign Affair will act as expert.

Aircraft operator

The aircraft operator is responsibility includes:

- Confirmation of the involvement of family member in the accident;
- Liaison with families;
- Identification custody and return of human remains;
- Protection and return of personal effects;
- Memorials.





Aircraft operator

- Aircraft operator established family liaison → involving psychology association.
- Collected the families in one location (hotel).
- Top management statement.
- Insurance claim
- Assisted the families for religion congregation (worship).

Local assistances









Briefing to the families

- KNKT considers that accident victims and their families are the first priority to know the investigation result.
- Informing the progress of the investigation to the families prior to the media (public), during the significant progress of the investigation especially for preliminary and final report.
- Conducted in the city of departure and destination.
- Recent experience requires distribution of the progress when the investigation unable to be completed in 1 year. (interim statement)



Briefing to the families

- Family members only, no media.
- Separated between crew and passenger families.
- The KNKT involves psychology association during the family meeting.
- Selective information to prevent the families use the information in court such as B737-8(MAX) case.
- Sometimes they ask for unexpected information. (CCTV video record of the boarding process)
- It is not allowed to promise anything that is not our responsibility.

The social media

- Aircraft accident is always attracts media and the information (pictures) are easily distributes.
- Families know things quickly and uncontrolled.
- The information may creates assumption and opinion that may not true.

Analyst from the Social Media

- 1. "Something strange happened here, at the altitude of 5.400 feet, the aircraft speed was 115 knots, for a Boeing 737 this is a valid indication that the aircraft stall." 12,000 viewers on 3 weeks after the accident
- 2. "... if we look at the ground speed which was 115 knots, this is a strong indication that the aircraft was stall" 8 millions viewers on 3 weeks after the accident

Briefing to the media / public

- · Who say what and when.
- Discussion with all involve parties (aviation authority, investigation authority, SAR, aircraft operator, etc).



Briefing to the media / public

- To avoid crowd during the Covid-19 pandemic, KNKT regularly informed the investigation progress by making short video and uploaded in social media (facebook, twitter, and Instagram).
- This method considered effective and controllable.

Briefing to the media / public

- Conducted if any significant progress. On the early stage it can be daily;
- Selected information
 - Only information that has been confirmed and not restricted information;
 - Progress and plan of the investigation.
 - Not the cause of the accident.
- Consider the prime time news;
- Distribute information also on KNKT social media.
