(Singapore, 16-17 August 2023)

MEETING BULLETIN

1. Date and Venue

The ICAO Regional Accident Investigation Workshop, Asia and Pacific Regions (Workshop) will be held on 15 August 2023. This will be followed by the 11th Meeting of the Asia Pacific Accident Investigation Group (APAC-AIG/11) of the ICAO Regional Aviation Safety Group – Asia and Pacific Regions (RASG-APAC), which will be held at the same venue on 16 to 17 August 2023.

The Workshop and APAC-AIG/11 Meeting will start at 0900h (all times used are in Singapore local time, i.e. UTC+8) each day at the **Parkroyal on Kitchener Road Hotel in Singapore (address 181 Kitchener Road, Singapore 208533)**.

Lunches and tea breaks will be provided to participants on 15 – 17 August 2023.

There is no fee to attend the Workshop and/or the APAC-AIG/11 Meeting. However, participants are required to cover their own expenses, including but not limited to air travel, transportation, accommodation, living expenses and (if applicable) medical.

2. On-site Registration

Participants attending Workshop and APAC-AIG/11 Meeting

- Registration will commence at 0830h on the 15 August 2023 .

Participants attending only the APAC-AIG/11 Meeting

- Registration will commence at 0830h on 16 August 2023.

Each participant will be given an identification badge upon registration. Participants are requested to wear the identification badge for all activities during the Workshop and the meeting.

3. Hotel Reservation

Participants are required to arrange for and cover their own accommodation. The Parkroyal on Kitchener Road will be providing discounted rates for participants staying at their hotel. 4. Passport or Visa

At the time of writing, there are no COVID-19 measures for travellers arriving in Singapore regardless of vaccination status of traveller profile. Notwithstanding, participants are to check the Singapore Immigration and Checkpoints Authority's (ICA's) website (see link below) for the latest COVID-19 developments.

For entry into Singapore, all visitors must hold a passport with at least six months validity.

Singapore time is eight hours ahead of the Coordinated Universal Time (i.e. UTC+8)
