

Proposed Approach to Study to Enhance Cooperation among Training Organisations in Asia Pacific Region

1. BACKGROUND

At the 9th meeting of the Regional Cooperation Mechanisms Taskforce Meeting (RCM TF) in Nov 2022, members were encouraged to enhance cooperation among training organisations in the provision of training to aviation personnel in the Asia Pacific region.

The Working Group formed under Recommendation B.2 of the Implementation Roadmap, comprising the Republic of Korea, Singapore, and the United States, will look into this and provide inputs to the RCM TF report to be submitted at APAC DGCA/58 Conference.

2. OBJECTIVES

- Enhance regional capacity building initiatives through better coordination and collaboration among States/Administrations and industry, including training institutes, to fulfil training needs of the Asia Pacific region.

3. PRELIMINARY IDEAS

- Enhance coordination and cooperation among States/Administrations and industry, including:
 - Share best practices and priorities for training
 - Inform on the type and availability of training offered by various aviation training organisations in the Asia Pacific region (see list of ICAO Trainair Plus organisations in Annex A).
- Identify training areas of priority in the region
 - Leverage on updated Needs Survey (Recommendation A.1 of Implementation Roadmap) to identify training needs and priorities of the region and its sub-regions.

- Fulfil training needs
 - Map training needs against training offerings by other aviation training organisations
 - Consider forms of training assistance and how to fund these, e.g. inviting training institutes to offer training spaces in specific courses or training areas to the region
 - Enhance in-region training delivery
- Consider **‘train the trainer’** proposal to build pipeline of instructors and enhance their capabilities
 - Identify and train a pool of trainers in the region for good geographical coverage
 - Standardise such training to ensure quality and effectiveness of training delivery
 - Put in place performance indicators such as information on how many new trainees are trained by each new trainer over time
 - Consider funding options to support this proposal
