Safety Priorities for 2024

- Strengthened safety of civil aviation at the regional level;
 - Assist States in the implementation of policies and provisions in order to strengthen the safety oversight competencies of states.
 - Coordinate/Conduct regional training and workshops supporting states in enhancing Safety Oversight competency.
 - Organize, conduct and monitor Technical Assistance Missions to states in the APAC region, in order to improve regional and state EI score.
 - implementation of the Global, Regional and National Aviation Safety Plans;
 - Follow up and Monitor States for the development and implementation of their NASP
 - Monitor bi-annually the progress of implementation of AP-RASP and APAC regional States NASPs

- Assist States in the implementation of SSP and SMS
 - Coordinate and conduct SSP implementation Training Sessions, work shops or Seminars in order to enhance SSP implementation in APAC
- Promote and support the establishment, operation and sustainability of regional/sub-regional cooperation programmes /projects (RSOO, COSCAP, RAIO, ARCM, etc.)

Missions be undertaken to selected States to examine and make recommendations on:

Air Traffic Control (ATC) operations including:

Airspace classification and determination of services (e.g. surveillance-based separation, procedural separation);

Separation minimums applied;

ATM automation system capability usage;

Flight plan and associated ATS message handling;

Structure, content and accessibility of operational procedure manuals, formal coordination and similar agreements, operational checklists, etc; and Operating environment, operational supervision and work practices within ATC units;

AIS operations, including;

Existence and quality of, and regulatory support for, formal agreements between aeronautical data originators and the AIS;

Processes for reception handling of aeronautical data;

Processes for production of aeronautical information products, and the quality management applied;

Analysis of current AIP and other aeronautical information products, with a focus on consistency of information and evidence of quality management problems.

 CAT-AVSEC mission (more focused on assistance for operational implementation of avsec measures - that may entail follow-up assisting actions) and focus on identification and resolving of actual or potential SSeCs



Providing support to States that may not be in ICAO's capacity e.g. security equipment and screening training/certification CBT systems, complementary training to ICAO ASTPs, provision of AVSEC tools (e.g. QC database), sharing of good practices (e.g. establishing NATFC) etc.
