What are the areas the South East Asia region could address collaboratively?





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### **Aviation Safety Commitments:**

- (a) Progressively enhance safety oversight capability to exceed global USOAP EI score by 2022.
- (b) Implement an effective State Safety Programme (SSP) by 2025.
- (c) Avoid Significant Safety Concerns (SSCs) under the USOAP-CMA else resolve future SSCs within agreed time frame,
- (d) Certify all aerodromes used for international operations by 2020.

### **Air Navigation Services Commitments**

- a) implementation of Performance Based Navigation (PBN);
- b) Transitioning from Aeronautical Information Service (AIS) to Aeronautical Information Management (AIM) System.





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### During the Beijing Declaration, Honorable Ministers also acknowledged;

- ➤ Regional partnerships like COSCAPs and FPP should evolve with meaningful technical cooperation and assistance.
- ➤ Compelling need for stronger regional cooperation, partnerships and engagement to continuously improve aviation safety.

### From COSCAP-SEA perspective:

COSCAP-SEA is one such cooperative arrangements of the Members which promotes collaboration amongst Members as well as Partners of the Programme.

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### WAY Forward: The areas where supports are needed:

- developing and/or amending legislation, policies, procedures and guidance material
- developing, amending and implementing training policies, programmes and plans
- assisting in safety oversight tasks, (initial certification/approval/renewal), surveillance inspections/audits,\*
- ➤ assisting for USOAP CMA on-site activities, ICAO Coordinated Validation Missions (ICVMs), and developing amending/updating Corrective Action Plans (CAPs).
- ➤ Implementation support for SSP/SMS and PBN





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### **Examples of collaborations on COSCAP-SEA Platform**:

- ➤ ICAO-RO planned and provided Combined Action Team Missions (CATM), PBN Go Teams, Runway Safety Go Teams and Aerodrome Assistance Go Team.
- ➤ Other COSCAPs have extended their resources in terms of training and SMEs.
- FPP programme has provided training, workshops and Experts for Go Team
- Singapore provided trainers and SMEs since inception,
- Indonesia supported by way of secondment of an expert.
- ➤ ACI, DGAC-France, EASA, FAA, IATA, CAA-UK have constantly supported with trainers and SMEs
- Airbus and Boeing have always extended in-kinds support.





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**The Sub-Regional Activities and support**: COSCAP-SEA has delivered numerous training, workshops, in-country missions to meet the Beijing Declaration targets. The Annual Work Plan for 2024-25, to be presented during SCM/21 has focus on these targets and anticipate support by way of: States and Partners may consider:
