# ICAO Engagement across the Asia Pacific Region

**Analysis of Survey Results** 

At the RCMTF/9 meeting in November 2022, States noted the need for the RCMTF to identify common needs across the region and develop action to address these gaps.

The implementation roadmap was updated to account for this. To identify these needs, the following two surveys have now been conducted by the RCMTF:

- Needs Survey in May June 2023
- Survey on understanding ICAO engagement across the APAC region in December 2023.

This survey seeks to understand ICAO engagement across the region and how States/Administrations manage State Letters, including identifying whether there are any challenges that the RCMTF can help address.

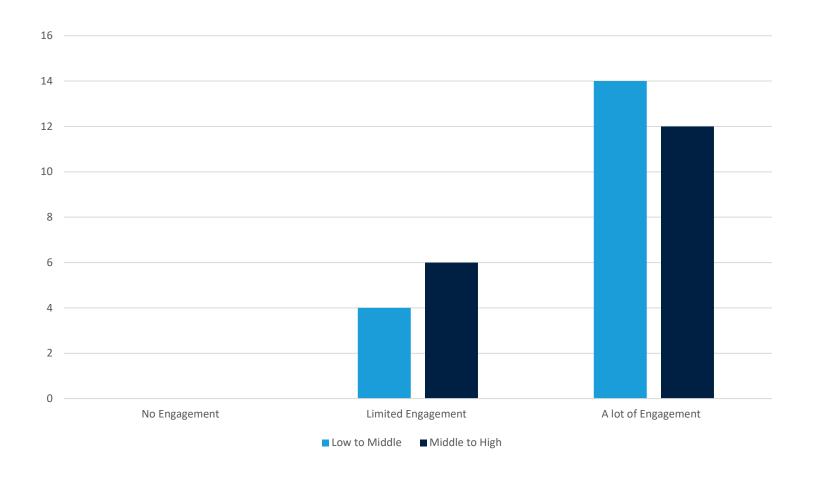

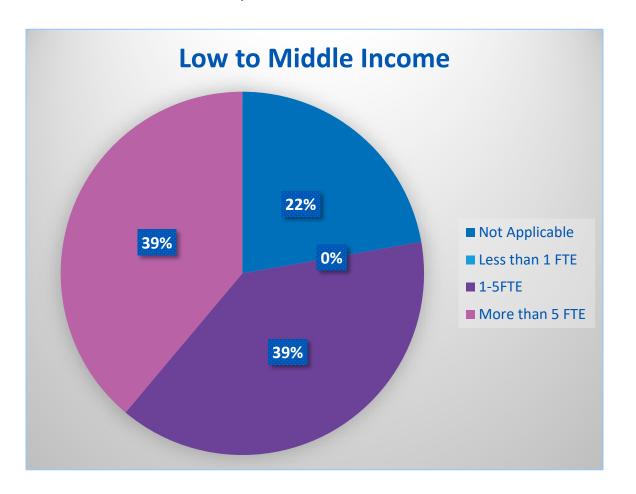

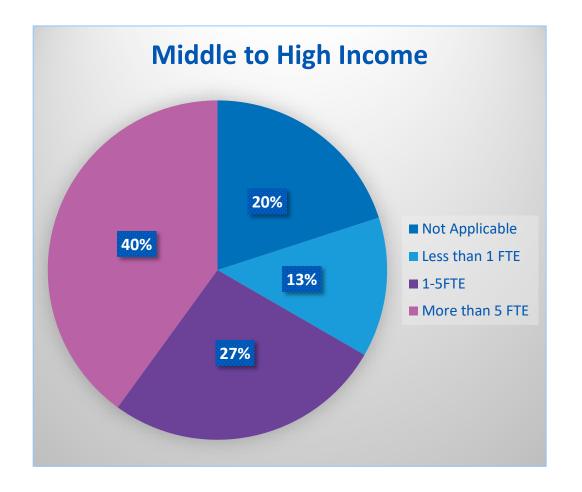

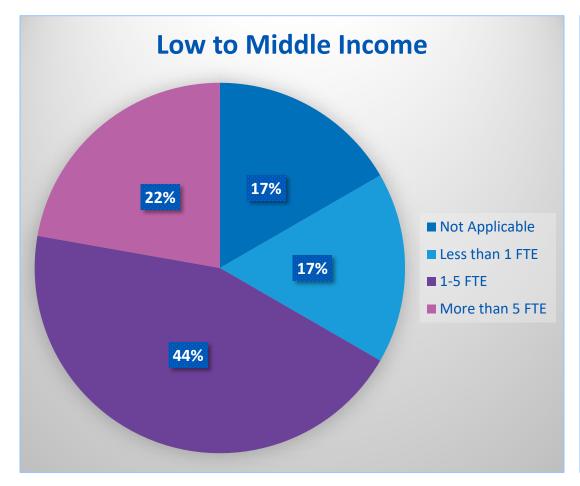


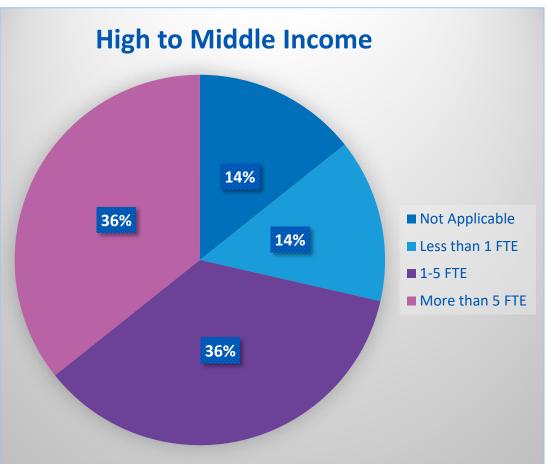
Q2: How big is your States/Administration's international engagement team? (FTE = Full-time equivalent staff member)



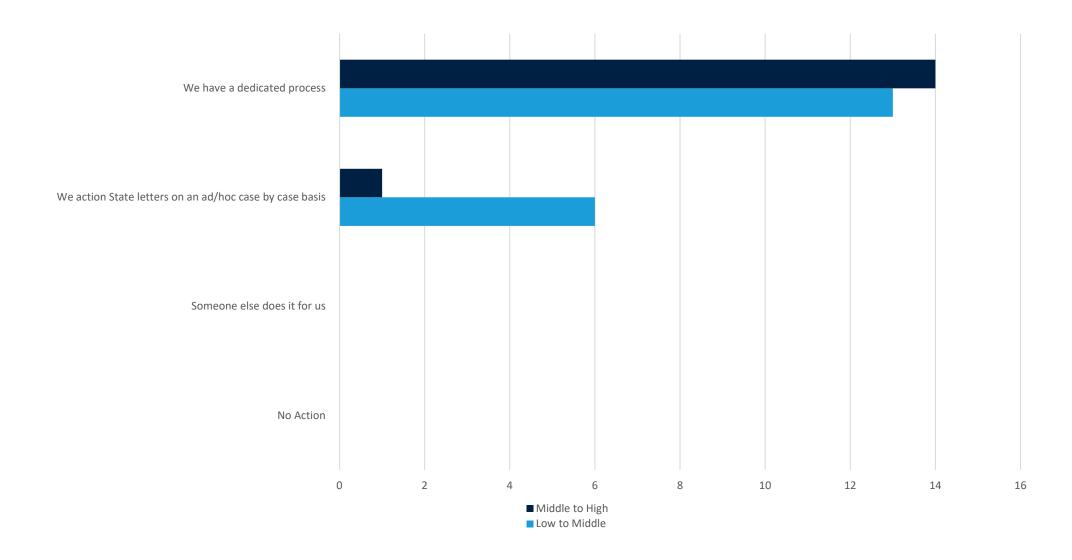


Q3: How big is your States/Administration's team responsible for processing State Letters (not including other engagement with ICAO)?

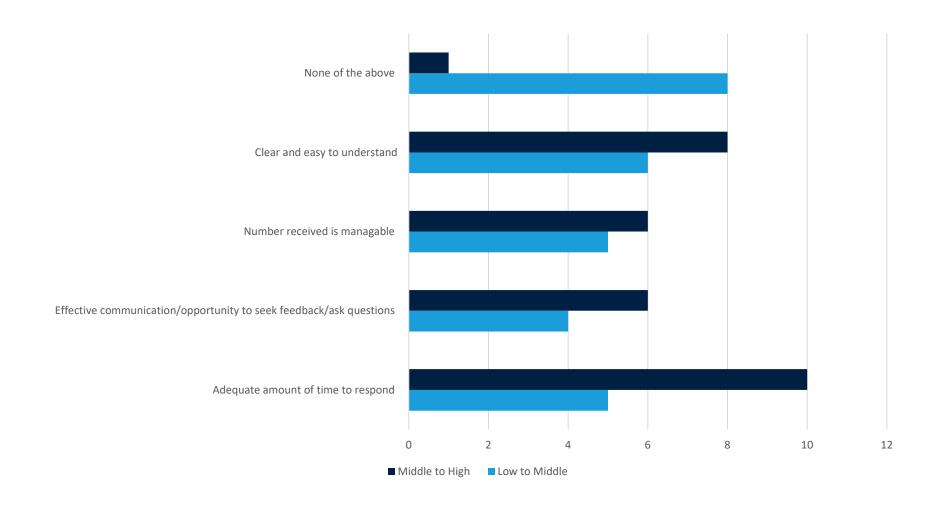




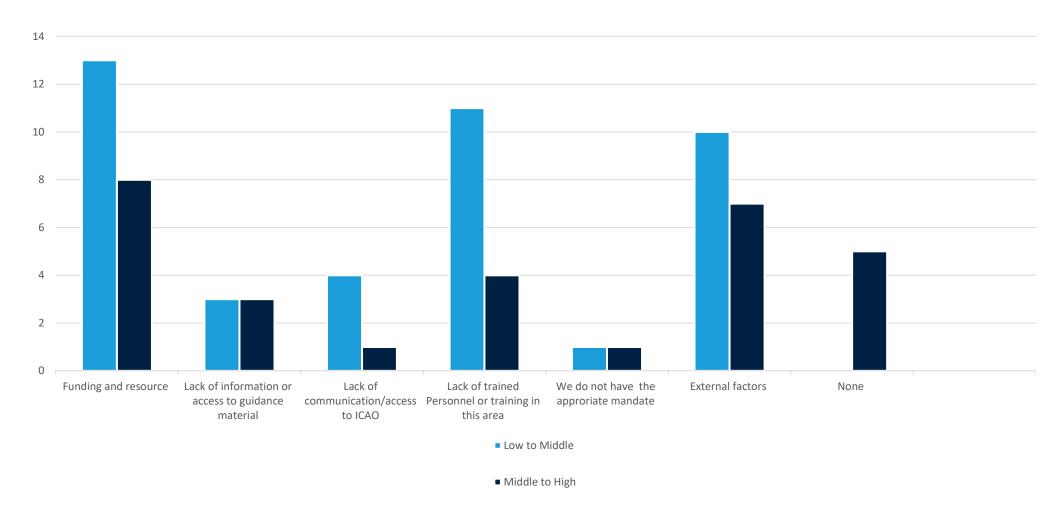
### Q4: How does your State/Administration action State Letters from ICAO?



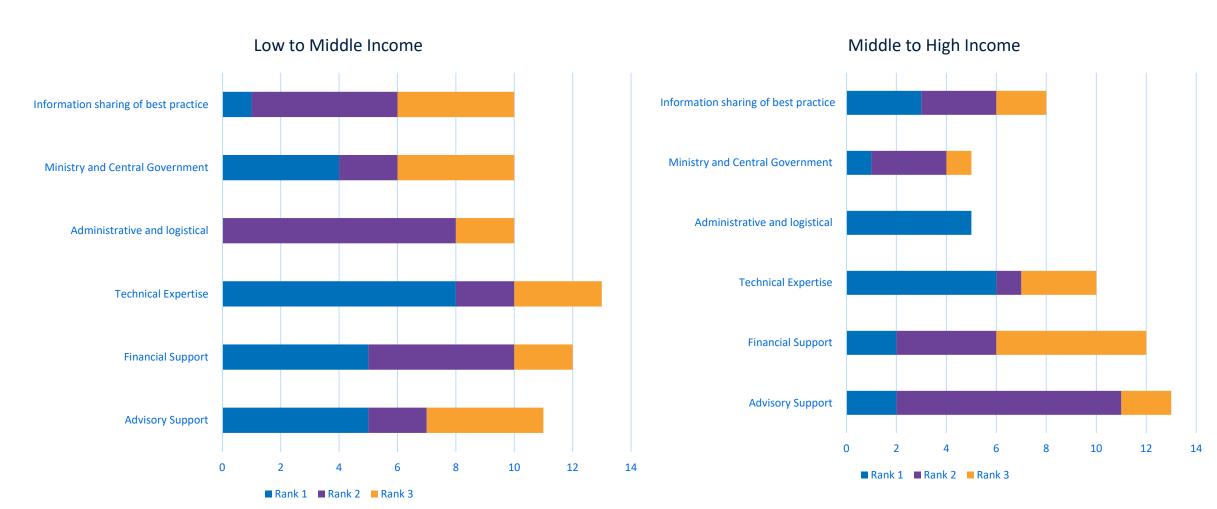
#### Q5: Which of the following would you say is done well by ICAO in relation to State Letters?

### **Freeform comments**

- Freeform comments suggest that many have found a lot of value in regional groups especially for information sharing.
- Some States/Administrations expressed their willingness to share information on various systems and processes, which could be useful for addressing the clear gap in technical expertise.

 Many respondents emphasised the need for improved communications from ICAO and the need for the State Letter process to be more simplified.

### **Key Observations**

Majority of States/Administrations
have the capacity required to
effectively engage with the State
Letter process, however, technical
knowledge, as well as the ability to
communicate with ICAO is a limiting
factor in this.

 Many of these survey questions, especially the ones regarding what ICAO does or does not do well highlights the need for ICAO to develop its processes to support the varying needs of States/Administrations. This is particularly important when considering ICAOs 'No Country Left Behind' initiative.

### **Next Steps**

- These findings will be used to inform a paper to presented at DGCA/59.
- This paper will use the findings from this survey to suggest improvements to the State Letter process and wider ICAO engagement.
- The findings from this survey, combined with the 2023 Needs analysis survey, will help to inform Part 3 of the Civil Aviation Commission Feasibility Study.
