### The International Registry

- The International Registry is an electronic registry which operates under the legal framework of the CTS. It provides for the electronic registration and the protection of "international interests" which are assigned by all ratifying states, with priority being determined on a "first-to-file" basis.
- It is available for use seven days a week on a twenty-four hour basis except for limited periods during which it may be closed as necessary for maintenance, technical upgrades or other special circumstances.
- The International Registry provides for the registration of interests in aircraft, aircraft engines, propellers, and spare parts by MRO rather than nationality registration.
- Interests are registered electronically with the consent of the appropriate parties.
- To date, 166 registrations have been made in the International Registry.









## The International Registry

- The International Registry is an electronic registry which operates under the legal framework of the UNCITRAL Convention on the International Registry of Interests in Movable Property (the "Convention"). It provides for the electronic registration and the protection of "international interests" which are recognized by all ratifying states, with priority being determined on a "first-to-file" basis.
- It is available for use seven days a week on a twenty-four hour basis except for limited periods during which it may be closed as necessary for maintenance, technical upgrades or other special circumstances.
- The International Registry provides for the registration of interests in assets which are identifiable assets by MSA rather than nationality registration.
- Interests are registered electronically with the consent of the appropriate parties.
- To date, 1,600 registrations of interests have been made in the International Registry.





The International Registry

- The International Registry is an electronic registry which operates under the legal framework of the CFC. It provides for the safe, secure registration and the protection of "exceptional interests" which are recognized by all contracting states, with priority being determined on a "first to file" basis.
- It is available for use 24 hours a day and 7 days a week, allowing for the registration of interests during periods when it may be closed or restricted for maintenance, technical upgrades or other special circumstances.
- The International Registry provides for the registration of interests in aircraft, including aircraft objects, to be held under the control of the registration.
- Interests are registered electronically with the consent of the appropriate parties.
- To date, 120 registrations and 1, 300 interests have been made in the International Registry.





#### The International Registry

- The International Registry is an electronic registry which operates under the legal framework of the CTC. It provides for the electronic registration and the protection of "international interests" which are recognized by all ratifying states, with priority being determined on a "first to file" basis.
- It is available for use more than a week on a twenty-four hour basis except for limited periods during which it may be closed as necessary for maintenance, technical upgrades or other special circumstances.
- The International Registry provides for the registration of interests as against uniquely identifiable aircraft objects by MRO rather than national registration.
- Interests are registered electronically with the consent of the appropriate parties.
- To date, 146 registrations and 2,700 searches have been made in the International Registry.

- The International Registry is an electronic registry which operates under the legal framework of the CFC. It provides for the electronic registration and the protection of "International Interests" which are recognized by all ratifying states, with priority being determined on a "first-to-file" basis.
- It is available for use seven days a week on a twenty-four hour basis except for limited periods during which it may be closed as necessary for maintenance, technical upgrades or other special circumstances.
- The International Registry provides for the registration of interests in uniquely identifiable aircraft objects by MRA rather than nationality registration.
- Interests are registered electronically with the consent of the appropriate parties.
- To date, 1,816 registrations and 1,760 searches have been made in the International Registry.
