4. Transfer Services

4.1 Participants may require to make their own transportation arrangement upon arrival in and departure from Pokhara. Most of the hotels run their transfer service to and from the airport with additional charges. Public transportation is easily accessible at the hotels. "Indrive" and "Pathao" are the mostly used Apps for taxi services in Nepal.

5. Visa, Insurance and Customs

- Participants must possess the documentation required to enter and stay in Nepal. Participants may wish to obtain information on Nepal entry requirements by accessing the Department of Immigration website (https://nepaliport.immigration.gov.np/).
- 5.2 Application for visa is the responsibility of the State or delegate concerned and should be requested well in advance as for certain countries visa processing may require additional security screening time. In case a visa support letter is required, the appropriate authority, administration or State in question should send a request, on official letterhead, to the ICAO APAC Office, at least 6 weeks before the start of the meeting. No personal invitations can be issued by ICAO.
- 5.3 Participants must be medically fit and in possession of insurance coverage to meet expenses for any unexpected event, including illness or medical emergency during the meeting. ICAO will not take responsibility for any expenses incurred concerning participation to its meetings/events.

5.4 Please refer to the Department of Customs, Nepal Website (https://customs.gov.np/) for the restrictions on the import of foreign currency.

6. Travel to Pokhara

- 6.1 Participants are required to travel to Tribhuvan International Airport, Kathmandu. Once guests arrive, they must transfer to Tribhuvan Domestic Airport Departure Terminal to travel to Pokhara International Airport.
- Pokhara International Airport is in Pokhara, Gandaki Province, Nepal. The airport is about 4.5 km from the city center and 7 km from the meeting venue. For the convenience of the arriving guests, our representative at the transfer desk at Tribhuvan International Airport, Kathmandu, will assist the officials in transferring to the Tribhuvan Domestic Airport Departure Terminal. Likewise, a similar transfer desk will be located at Pokhara International Airport to guide the arriving delegates to the Hotel upon arrival.
- 6.3 Once the guests arrive at Tribhuvan International Airport, Kathmandu, three major domestic carriers offer flight services with special rates for the program.

7. Further Information

- 7.1 Information about weather condition may be found on the website of Nepal Department of Hydrology and Meteorology at https://www.dhm.gov.np/. Tropical or light weight and washable cottons will suffice and woolens are not necessary.
- 7.2 Dress code for the meeting is formal. Casual clothing is not suitable for the meeting.
- 7.3 Nepal time is five hours and forty-five minutes (05:45) ahead of Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC+05:45).
- 7.4 International credit cards such as American Express, Visa, Master Card, etc. are normally accepted at major hotels and department stores.

- 7.5 Most of the commercial banks exchange major foreign currencies and are open from 10:00 to 16:00 hours from Sunday through Thursday and from 10:00 to 13:00 on Friday, while some keep the foreign exchange counter open until 21:00 hours. Foreign exchange counters operated by various commercial banks are located at several places in the city and are also open on Saturdays and public holidays. To change travellers' cheques, you are required to show your passport.
- 7.6 The type of electrical plug and socket typically used in Nepal is Type C, D, and M plug. The standard voltage is 230 V at a frequency of 50 Hz.
