Reminder on ICAO provisions

- Member States shall take effective measures to prevent the <u>spread by means of air navigation of communicable diseases</u> and keep in close consultation with the agencies concerned with international regulations relating to sanitary measures applicable to aircraft (Chicago Convention Article 14).
- Member States shall establish National Air Transport Facilitation Programmes (NATFP) to define the mandates and responsibilities of various national stakeholders including responsibilities for managing Public Health Emergencies of International Concern (Annex 9, Standard 8.17).
- Member States shall establish National Air Transport Facilitation Committees (NATFC), and Airport Facilitation Committees or <u>similar coordinating bodies</u> to serve as <u>permanent bodies</u> for <u>coordinating activities between all national stakeholders</u> <u>responsible for the implementation of the NATFP</u> (Annex 9, Standard 8.19).

Situation before COVID-19

- According to ICAO's Electronic Filing of Differences (EFOD) System only 53% of States in the EUR/NAT Regions filed compliance with Standards 8.17 and 8.19;
- > 47% of States did not provide any information;
- ➤ The ICAO/EUR/NAT Office approached Member States in April 2020 (beginning of the Pandemic) to understand better how the response to COVID-19 was coordinated. It was recognized that the vast majority of States developed their own new mechanism and the NATFC was either not used or did not exist.







MEASURES AND ACTIONS TAKEN

2014-2016: Coordination carried out within the framework of the **National Security Committee**

Development of a standard operating procedure for handling flights of Ambulance aircraft, transporting people from countries affected with Ebola or people infected or suspected of being infected with the Ebola virus, in case of a technical stop or emergency;

Publication of aeronautical information circulars relating to airports in Morocco where aircraft carrying people from countries affected by Ebola or people infected with the Ebola virus, can make technical stops;

Organization of a simulation exercise in response to a highly transmissible contagious disease, case of Ebola, on May 30, 2015;

Measures and

Since the COVID-19 pandemic was declared as a "Public health emergency of international concern" and in light of the development of the novel coronavirus COVID-19 internationally, the Moroccan Civil Aviation Authority, in close coordination with various actors concerned, has taken the following actions to:

- Reduce the spread of "COVID-19" by air transport;
- · Protect the health of passengers, ground and flight personnel and the public;
- Ensure the continuity of cargo flights and the global air cargo supply chain.

National COVID-19 monitoring and response plan "Central Coordination Post" -PCC-



NATFC

Coordination of aspects related to the Civil Aviation sector

- Organization of coordination meetings of the **NATFC** and **the NCASC**;
- Conduct of supervision activities to inquire about the level of implementation of the recommendations relating to the context of the COVID 19 pandemic;
- Diffusion of notes, circulars, guide, etc..;
- Coordination at the airport level is ensured via the Local Air Transport
 Facilitation Committees.

Measures and actions taker

- Guideline regarding health measures recommended for the management of passenger journeys (1st edition published on 09 June 2020);
 - ONDA, airlines, as well as other airport service providers have drawn up operational guides and manuals containing guidelines and procedures adapted to the period of sanitary crisis;
- « HEALTH PASSENGER FORM » :
 - Developed by the PCC and validated by the NATFC;
 - Management process established by the NATFC;
- Recommendations related to security requirment implementation within the framework of the resumption of air transport activity, in accordance with « CART Take-off Guidance »



Difficulties faced

- Maintaining appropriate balance between AVSEC measures and public health measures;
- Conducting effective oversight both on implementing effective AVSEC measures and public health measures;
- Maintaining security staff competency, including security screening staff, during inactivity and reduced operations;
- Difficulty to respect physical distancing especially during high activity (Infrastructural capacity, passengers and personnel constraints);
- Lack of human resources needed to implement new measures;
- Lack of resources to assess public health measures implementation;
- Managing unruly passengers situations relating to non respect of public health measures;

Lessons learnt

- Role of an effective coordination and communication;
- The need to be prepared to such emergencies:
 - Regulatory level;
 - Operational level, including exercises;
- The importance of Technology and digitalization;

« Pandemic culture! »

Lessons Learned

- ➤ The insufficient level of implementation of Annex 9 SARPs (8.17 and 8.19), specifically the lack of proper and functioning NATFC's, led to a lack of effective coordination and cooperation of contingency measures, recovery and restart;
- ➤ The establishment of ad-hoc coordination bodies for managing the pandemic resulted in unseasoned and inefficient coordination and delayed an effective response;
- To support States in a better implementation of respective SARPs, ICAO has developed:
 - Annex 9 Facilitation Course;
 - Facilitation Implementation Package (iPack) with a focus on the role and implementation of a NATFP and the NATFC as well as the airport committees

States are urged to implement Annex 9 SARPS, establish a NATFP, NATFC and Airport Committees, define responsibilities, meet regularly and prepare for the response to Crisis Scenarie affecting Civil Aviation
