10.45 – 11.45 Session 1	From Commitment to Implementation – Advancing Accessible, Inclusive and Seamless Air Transport This session will provide a comprehensive, forward-looking reflection on the evolution of accessibility in international air transport, while simultaneously contributing to shaping the strategic direction for the period 2026–2028. Building on discussions initiated at the first global gathering in 2024, participants will examine how accessibility has transitioned from a policy objective to a recognized strategic, system-wide priority across the aviation sector. Attention will be given to the growing global emphasis on inclusiveness, reinforced during the 42nd ICAO Assembly, and to Assembly Resolution A42-14, which underscores the protection of vulnerable passengers and embeds accessibility within broader Facilitation objectives. The session will highlight the cross-cutting nature of accessibility, emphasizing its strong linkages with safety, security, passenger experience, and human rights considerations. By positioning accessibility as an essential pillar of modern aviation planning and service delivery, discussions will aim to move beyond commitments toward practical, measurable, and scalable implementation across States and industry stakeholders. The discussion will also identify concrete follow-up actions to improve implementation, foster innovation, and maintain sustained, structured engagement with persons with disabilities, industry partners, and Member States beyond the Symposium. By aligning strategic vision with actionable outcomes, this session aims to ensure that accessibility remains a sustained global priority and is effectively integrated into aviation systems worldwide through 2028 and beyond. 13.30 – 14.30 Session 2	Global Regulatory Landscape: Accessibility Commitments This session will review the ongoing evolution of the regulatory and policy framework on accessibility. Participants will explore how States are increasingly aligning accessibility obligations with broader facilitation and consumer-protection responsibilities, including national legislation in line with ICAO Standards and relevant Convention obligations, and oversight expectations. Regional authorities and industry stakeholders will share updates on how inclusiveness for persons with disabilities and reduced mobility have become a central component of their aviation policy agendas. This discussion will help illuminate how regulatory momentum is converging toward more harmonized global expectations for accessible air transport, while recognizing the need for practical regulatory principles and implementation approaches that can be applied across different national, regional, and operational contexts. 14.30 – 15.30 Session 3	Designing with Empathy: Integrating Passenger Lived Experience into Universal, Future-Ready Aviation Infrastructure This session integrates lived passenger experiences with the design of future aviation systems. It highlights journeys of passengers with disabilities across the full travel chain—from booking to arrival—showcasing key challenges and solutions across a wide range of visible and non-visible conditions. The discussion will explore how these experiences can inform airport infrastructure, services, and operations, including ways to capture input from those unable to self-advocate through engagement with caregivers, organizations, and frontline staff. It will also address intersectional vulnerabilities and facilitation processes for at-risk travellers. Experts will examine how universal design is transforming airport environments, covering innovations in layouts, wayfinding, digital tools, and boarding systems. Emphasis will be placed on integrating accessibility early in planning, including standards, procurement, and project governance. It underscores that accessibility must be embedded by design, as a core element of modern, inclusive aviation. 16.00 – 17.00 Session 4	Digital Accessibility: Technology, Identity and Passenger Empowerment Digital transformation is reshaping the passenger journey, and this session will examine how accessibility must be firmly embedded in emerging digital identities, seamless travel processes, and biometric systems. Participants will discuss Assembly-supported initiatives related to digital travel credentials and passenger-processing modernization, highlighting how these systems can either empower or marginalize passengers with disabilities while including cybersecurity considerations. The session will also analyse accessibility challenges in booking platforms, mobile applications, airline websites, and real-time communication tools. Special attention will be paid to the needs of passengers with cognitive or neurodivergent disabilities who may face unique barriers in navigating digital travel systems. The session will also examine accessible, low-friction processes being designed as part of the mainstream passenger experience. The session will also consider how privacy-preserving tools and passenger-controlled information-sharing could help frontline employees respond more effectively to individual needs, including for passengers who use Alternative and Augmentative Communication devices or who require support that may not be immediately visible. 09.00 – 10.00 Session 5	Safety, Security & Dignity: Building a Holistic Facilitation Environment Anchored in Assembly Resolution A42-14 and broader facilitation concerns, this session will explore how safety, security, and accessibility intersect throughout the aviation system. Discussions will address the importance of supporting vulnerable passengers and at risk travellers through respectful and trauma informed assistance practices. The session will also examine how accessibility can be managed through structured programmes, quality assurance, employee reporting, performance monitoring, and continuous improvement. Participants will highlight the need for robust programmes including training, strengthened cross-sector collaboration, and operational preparedness in the face of disruptions. The emphasis will be on continuity planning that ensures accessible services remain reliable even during irregular operations. Drawing on principles from safety culture and operational assurance, presenters will consider how airports, airlines, and service providers can move beyond one-time initiatives toward sustained accessibility management. Drawing from Assembly outcomes that emphasize the importance of alignment and shared responsibility, speakers will explore how airports, airlines, and regulators can collaborate more effectively to enhance passenger experience and operational efficiency. Discussions will also highlight potential frameworks for monitoring accessibility performance, supporting implementation, and promoting continuous improvement across regions. The session will also consider how global and regional partnerships can support practical implementation, including through shared guidance, performance indicators, quality assurance approaches, and mechanisms for identifying barriers that are not captured through traditional consultation or complaint channels.
