Gerald F. "Fred" Pease Jr., a member of the Senior Executive Service, is Executive Director, Department of Defense Policy Board on Federal Aviation, and Deputy Director of Operations, Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations, Plans and Requirements, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C. In his role as Deputy Director of Operations, Mr. Pease is responsible for policy, guidance and oversight of Air Force air, space, cyber and weather operations. The Directorate of Operations is the largest directorate on the Air Staff with more than 1,840 personnel, 23 divisions and three field operating agencies, including the Air Force Operations Group, Air Force Flight Standards Agency, and Air Force Weather Agency. As Executive Director of the DOD Policy Board on Federal Aviation, he represents DOD positions in support of the U.S. National Airspace System as a seamless partner with the Federal Aviation Administration. As the primary point of contact between DOD and the Department of Transportation on domestic and international civil aviation issues, he provides strategic vision and policy for DOD participation and partnering in U.S. and global air transportation systems.

Mr. Pease entered the Air Force in 1972. While on active duty, he served as an F-15 squadron commander and flew more than 2,900 hours in the F-4C/E and F-15A/C, including 31 combat missions during Operation Desert Storm. Mr. Pease also held several key staff positions, including assignments to the U.S. Embassy in Paris; the Joint Chiefs of Staff delegation to the NATO Military Committee in Brussels, Belgium; Headquarters 7th Air Force, South Korea; and the Air Staff.

Following his appointment to the Senior Executive Service in 2000, Mr. Pease was Associate Director for Ranges and Airspace at Headquarters U.S. Air Force. Prior to his current assignment, he served as Deputy Assistant Secretary for Basing and Infrastructure Analysis, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Installations, Environment and Logistics, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C., where he planned and directed the 2005 Air Force Base Realignment and Closure process.
