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OPERATIONAL SILOS

Despite integrated border management recommendations for intra- and inter-service cooperation

ABSENCE OF REAL-TIME DATA

Delays the early identification of threats, making it challenging to intercept and disrupt smugglers' activities

Leads to fragmented trend analysis, inconsistent policymaking and reduced operational preparedness

LACK OF INFORMATION-SHARING

Hampers the identification of individuals in vulnerable situations, including those who may require protection

Impedes coordinated investigations and prosecutions of organized criminal networks involved in migrant smuggling

RESTRICTIVE ENTRY POLICIES

Including timeconsuming checks at borders undermine broader goals of effective global migration governance








Global Dashboards on Irregular Migration

- The platform includes 9 distinct pages, each featuring with diverse dashboards that visualize the database through various dataset combinations


















This ensures that data analysts have all the necessary supporting evidence at their fingertips for reporting and/or further analysis.





P4. Movements

These dashboards provide detailed information on each case, enhancing the ability to analyze fraud incidents trends and contextualize primary-line responses effectively.

Data sets include:

- Interception Locations: The dashboards display where the reported fraud cases were intercepted.
- Issuing country of the travel document utilized

Travel Routes: They also show the related travel routes used in the intercepted cases.

Interactive Visualizations: Users can interact with the data to gain insights into patterns and trends.






P5. Travel Routes

This dashboard enables comprehensive risk analysis by interrelating various data sets, including:

- Document Type: To analyze risks based on the type of document used.
- Issuing State: To correlate data with the state that issued the document used.
- Country of Interception: To identify patterns related to where the document was intercepted.
- Country of Departure: To examine risks associated with the country of departure.
- Travel Route: To track and analyze the travel routes taken.
- Intended Country of Destination:

 To assess risks based on the intended destination country.






P6. Travel Routes and Hubs

This dashboard enables focus risk analysis by interrelating:

- Travel Route Utilized: To analyze risks based on the travel routes taken.
- Overall Trend: To identify and assess overall trends in fraud cases.
- Case Results Distribution:
 To examine the distribution of case results to understand
 patterns.

Specific Border Post Targeted: To analyze risks by specific border posts, divided by arrival and departure.








P7. Workstation Insights

Provides detailed insights into interception locations, helping to identify patterns and trends in fraudulent activities.

Analyzes spatial data by combining location-based information with numerical variables.

Tracks changes and trends over time, analyzing the distribution of scans by case result, document type, and transport type.








P8. Traveler Profile

By providing insights into demographic patterns and trends, the dashboard shows how organized crime may adapt their modus operandi in relation to sex, gender, and age-group of intercepted travellers.

This analysis helps in understanding how different demographic groups are targeted and exploited, enabling more effective prevention and intervention strategies.








P9. Country Insights

- It enables the comparison of data across different countries, helping to identify unique patterns, trends and commonalities in the modus operandi of organized crime.

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
