FAQ

What type of reports should be submitted to GDDB?

Any in-scope occurrence or event associated with ground operations, which results in **a near miss** or aircraft damage while parked at the gate / stand or other parked area, during marshaling or using stand guidance, during de-icing, while being towed, in the hangar and any slide deployments.




<u>Upload File(s)</u>

- Click on Choose File...
- Choose the file(s) you wish to upload from the dialog box that appears and click on Open
- Click on OK








Click on Save







Files

You could upload one file or multiple files. Files uploaded need to be in the format as provided by the GDDB template.

Please note that each uploaded file is subject to a structural check which will ensure that the content structure and headers are as provided with the GDDB template. A content check will be carried out to verify all individual fields are valid and in line with the prescriptions in Schedule D.



File Naming Convention

Please name your file(s) with the correct naming convention, which is:

yourcompanyname_Year_SUMMER_INCIDENT_GDDB

Or

yourcompanyname_Year_WINTER_INCIDENT_GDDB



File Naming Convention

SUMMER (April to September) WINTER (October to March)

For example:

ABC Airlines company submits 2018 Summer data, the name should be

ABCAirlines_2018_SUMMER_INCIDENT_GDDB
