Narrative Data

FAB 6560, a B737-210 operated by First Air, was on the ILS/DME approach to Runway 35T at Resolute Bay after a charter flight from Yellowknife when the aircraft collided with terrain approximately 1 mile east of the runway at 7443.13N/9455.12W. The aircraft was destroyed by impact forces and 12 of the 15 occupants were fatally injured, including all 4 crew. The three survivors were assisted by Canadian Forces personnel who were already on site as part of Operation Nanook and were subsequently medevac'd to hospitals in Igaluit and Ottawa. Their injuries are considered non life-threatening. Weather was reported to be a 200 foot ceiling with 3 miles visibility in fog and drizzle; wind was 180 degrees at 10 knots.

TSB investigators were also on site and will conduct a Class 2 investigation. A Minister's Observer has been appointed and is also on site.

UPDATE

TSB reported that the First Air Boeing 737-210C combi aircraft, registration C-GNWN, was being flown as a charter flight from Yellowknife, NWT to Resolute Bay, NU. During the approach to Runway 35T, the aircraft struck a hill about 1 nautical mile east of the midpoint of the Resolute Bay airport runway. There were four crew members and 11 passengers on board the aircraft. The crew members and eight passengers were fatally injured. Three passengers survived the accident and were recovered from the site by Canadian military personnel who were in Resolute Bay for Exercise Op Nanook. The aircraft was destroyed and there was a post-impact fire.
