What is Carbon Offsetting in Aviation?

In general, offsetting occurs when airlines compensate for their emissions by purchasing and canceling emission units generated from projects or measures that reduce or remove greenhouse gases from the atmosphere.







CEEUs are "carbon offsets" approved by the ICAO Council, based on recommendations of the Technical Advisory Body (TAB).

CEEUs must meet the CORSIA Emissions Unit Criteria (EUC), which focus on programmelevel procedures to ensure the environmental and social integrity of the CEEUs.

Emissions units from ICAO Council-approved programmes are eligible for use under CORSIA. Information on the approved programmes and their scope of eligibility is available in the ICAO document: CORSIA Eligible Emissions Units.



Understanding the TAB and its role



An expert group of the ICAO Council...

...that assesses emissions unit programmes against CORSIA Emissions Unit Criteria.

Recommends a list of eligible emissions unit programmes, and their scope of eligibility, for the Council's approval.

Availability of CEEUs

Market availability of CORSIA Eligible Emissions Units is facilitated by the host country authorization.


Host country authorization (i.e. Letter of Authorization (LOA)) is important to avoid double claiming of units, confirming that:

- Emissions units to be used in CORSIA are not counted toward Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement (PA).
- Emissions units should be properly accounted (i.e. applying corresponding adjustments) in countries' national reports under the PA.

A voluntary standardized template for the host country authorization is available on the <u>UNFCCC Article 6 website</u>.



ICAO encourages governments hosting activities that generate CEEUs to issue the Letters of Authorization to facilitate the access and availability of CEEUs to aeroplane operators.



ICAO Process for CORSIA Eligible Emissions Units

Emissions Units + LOA = CEEU?



Host country authorization alone does not mean the eligibility of emissions units under CORSIA, which is decided only by the ICAO Council.
