NOTES

¹ By a Note dated 1/4/57, the Chargé d'affaires *ad interim* of Ceylon (now Sri Lanka), on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, informed the Secretary of State of the United States that "although no notice was given by Ceylon of adherence to the Transit Agreement, the Government of Ceylon considers itself a party to the International Air Services Transit Agreement since 31st May, 1945, the date on which the United Kingdom Government accepted the Agreement . . .".

² By a Note dated 24/4/51, the Government of Sri Lanka declared that it considered itself bound by the Warsaw Convention (before Sri Lanka became independent, acceptance of the Convention was effected by the United Kingdom on 3/12/34).

- 3 Signed with reservation as to acceptance.
- 4 Declaration, in accordance with Article XIII, paragraph 2, of the Convention, that Sri Lanka is not a producer State of plastic explosives.
- 5 At the time of accession, Sri Lanka declared that the terms of the *Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules for International Carriage by Air*, done at Montreal on 28 May 1999 “have been examined and found to be acceptable to the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka subject to reservations declared below as per Article 57 of the Convention:
- (a) international carriage by air performed and operated directly by that State Party for non –commercial purposes in respect to its functions and duties as a sovereign State; and/or
 - (b) the carriage of persons, cargo and baggage for its military authorities on aircraft registered in or leased by that State Party, the whole capacity of which has been reserved by or on behalf of such authorities.”
