Olivier Mrowicki joined the French Air Force in 1981. His professional background is air traffic controller (approach and tower) with both civil and military traffic.

He served across a number of military assignments, including the privilege to command an important ATC unit in the French Air Force, on the Nancy Air Base, providing at that time air traffic services to 60 Mirage 2000D fighters based, and to several civil airfields around.

He has also been involved in a number of international exercises and operations, especially in former Yugoslavia where he served under the UN and the NATO flags in several periods from 1994 to 2002.

He was seconded to ICAO as Director Air Navigation Services in the EC/ICAO Project launched in 2002 to rebuild the Civil Aviation Administration in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and subsequently inserted one year in the local administration.

He graduated the Joint Staff College in Paris in 2004 and then was in charge of European ATM affairs for the French Ministry of Defense, until he joined EUROCONTROL as the Head of Civil-Military SES Implementation Unit.

His unit works on support activities to the EUROCONTROL Member States and stakeholders, around the implementation of the SES and the best ways to guarantee a performing civil-military coordination in this environment. It includes support to the development and service of ATM civil-military tools supporting Flexible Use of Airspace, such as LARA and PRISMIL, but also support to the military involvement in European safety initiatives.

Since 2009, he is also the EUROCONTROL mandate manager for the development of Standardized European Rules of the Air (SERA) for the Single European Sky.
