

Paul Bartko is currently the Manager, Strategic Operations, System Operations Security, for the Federal Aviation Administration. He is responsible for the development of civil/military and ATM Security procedures, security strategic planning, and Crisis Response and Emergency Operations for the FAA Air Traffic Organization. System Operations Security serves as a facilitator with various security partners for balancing the needs of national security, aviation security and law enforcement with the operational and economic demands of aviation commerce.

Mr. Bartko began his air traffic controller career while serving in the United States Air Force. He started his career with the FAA in 1982 as an air traffic controller. He has served the FAA in various capacities as a traffic management specialist, supervisor, military operations specialist, international specialist, including tours in Brussels, Belgium and Abu Dhabi, UAE as an FAA representative, and finally in his current role as a Manager in FAA System Operations Security.

Mr. Bartko has worked civil and military issues with various States to include the Republic of Korea, Israel, Afghanistan, UAE and Iraq. In Iraq he served as the first FAA Senior Advisor to the Iraq civil aviation organization. Mr. Bartko's organization also manages airspace during natural or man-made crises, such as hurricanes, wildfires, earthquakes and the Deepwater oil spill. He deployed to Haiti to assist the Haitian civil aviation authority in improving flow management into Port au Prince immediately after the 2010 earthquake.
