Sir/Madam,

I wish to inform you that the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) is organizing courses on International Air Law to be held at the Regional Offices, during 2018, with the purpose of building capacities in this regard. The course for SAM States will be held at the ICAO Regional Office in Lima, Peru from 9 to 13 April 2018. In this regard, I wish to invite your State to nominate participants.

The International Air Law course is a five day classroom course currently provided in English language. The goal of this course is to enable representatives of civil aviation authorities, airports and air navigation service providers to support their organization in compliance with international air law through the application of appropriate knowledge gained through the review of aviation law instruments and case discussions.

The course is most beneficial for legal officers and administrators or managers with or without legal education from Civil Aviation Administrations, Civil Aviation Authorities and Airports and Air Navigation Service Providers of Member States.

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to accomplish the following:

- a) learn the concepts and rules of international air law;
- b) explain the relevance of the rules and procedures of international air law for their own role and functions in their organization; and

- c) apply their knowledge and understanding to assist their national administration in improving implementation.

The cost of the course is US \$ 1500 per participant. A group pricing scheme is available whereby a third complimentary registration is offered for every two paid registrations. The group pricing is applicable to nominees from civil aviation regulatory bodies applying simultaneously.

Due to capacity limitations, registrations will be on a first-come first-served basis. Please note that participants are responsible for their own travel arrangements, including hotel reservations, as well as travel and medical insurance. Before leaving their country of origin, all participants must ensure their travel documentation is in order.
