# Step 1 – Analysis Phase

- **Names/Infrastructure**
  - Indicate name of your State and the participants
  - Provide a summary of
    - Your organization format/structure
    - Traffic growth –current and future
    - current air navigation infrastructure in your State (Such as number of FIRs, international aerodromes, CNS, Etc)
    - Challenges referring to Technical, Operational and Economical issues
    - Stakeholder needs
    - Performance gaps

# Step 2 – Assessment phase



- **Review 18 Modules of ASBU Block 0**
  - Categorize 18 Modules (For guidance refer to WP9)
  - Identify operational requirements and prioritize the Modules and corresponding PIAs that are applicable to your State to mitigate gaps (for guidance refer to WP22)

# Step 3 – Implementation phase



- Study Air Navigation Report Form (ANRF) template available in WP21
- Using this template and guidance, fill-up ANRF for any two Block 0 Modules that you selected for your State in step 2. It includes implementation tasks and roadblocks.

# Step 4 – Monitoring Phase



- Continue with ANRF and Identify the performance indicator/supporting metrics (For guidance refer to WP 22)
  - Implementation indicator/metrics for each of those 2 ASBU Modules selected in step 3
  - Benefits metrics for each of those 2 Modules selected in step 3
