

Crimes Act 1961 (New Zealand)

270 Endangering transport

(1) Every one is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 14 years who, with intent to cause danger to persons or property or with reckless disregard for the safety of persons or property,—

(a) interferes with any transport facility; or

(b) does anything to any transport facility that is likely to cause danger to persons or property.

(2) For the purposes of this section, **transport facility** means any vehicle, ship, or aircraft, and any property used in connection with the transportation of persons or goods; and includes equipment of any kind used in navigation or for the guidance of any vehicle, ship, or aircraft.

Civil Aviation Act 1990 (New Zealand)

44 Dangerous activity involving aircraft, aeronautical product, or aviation related service

(1) Every person commits an offence who—

(a) operates, maintains, or services; or

(b) does any other act in respect of—

any aircraft, aeronautical product, or aviation related service, in a manner which causes unnecessary danger to any other person or to any property.

(2) Every person commits an offence who—

(a) causes or permits any aircraft, aeronautical product, or aviation related service to be operated, maintained, or serviced; or

(b) causes or permits any other act to be done in respect of any aircraft, aeronautical product, or aviation related service,—

in a manner which causes unnecessary danger to any other person or to any property.

(3) Every person who commits an offence against subsection (1) or subsection (2) is liable on conviction,—

(a) in the case of an individual, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months or a fine not exceeding \$10,000; or

(b) in the case of a body corporate, to a fine not exceeding \$100,000.

(4) The provisions of this section shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any regulations or rules made under this Act.
