1. MANDATE: A. CHICAGO CONV.

• Convention on International Civil Aviation

• Conference, Chicago, 1944

International treaty

• 191 Member States



- Article 10: Landing at customs airport
- Article 11: Applicability of air regulations
- Article 13: Entry and clearance regulations
- Article 14: Prevention of spread of disease
- Article 22: Facilitation of formalities
- Article 23: Customs and immigration procedures
- Article 24: Customs duty
- Article 29: Documents carried in aircraft
- Article 35: Cargo restrictions
- Article 37: Adoption of international standards and procedures



<u>Art. 10</u>: Aircraft to land at <u>designated</u> *customs* airport for customs & other examination

<u>Art. 13</u>: Passengers, crew, cargo: compliance with laws on *entry, clearance, immigration, passports, customs, quarantine*

<u>Art. 14</u>: State to take measures to prevent the *spread of disease*



<u>Art. 22</u>: Each Contracting State agrees to adopt all practicable measures . . .

- to facilitate & expedite navigation by aircraft . . . & to prevent unnecessary delays to aircraft, crews, passengers and cargo
 - → especially in the administration of the laws relating to *immigration, quarantine, customs & clearance.*

→ "Facilitation of formalities"

Art. 23: State to establish C & I procedures in accordance with practices recommended (by ICAO) [>Art. 37]



<u>Art. 29</u>: Documents carried in aircraft: . . . (d) journey log book [Gen Dec acceptable]; (f) passenger manifest; (g) cargo manifest

Art. 37 (Adoption of SARPs)

Art. 38 [Compliance]; Art. 90 [Amendment]



Article 37

(Adoption of International Standards and Procedures)

1.Each State undertakes to collaborate in securing. . . uniformity . . . regulations, standards . . . facilitate & improve air navigation.

2.ICAO required to adopt SARPs . . .

- (j) Customs & immigration procedures . . .

& such other matters concerned with the . . . regularity & efficiency of air navigation . . .

Question: "What is facilitation"?

Facilitation is the **efficient** management of **border control processes** to expedite clearance (of aircraft, passengers/crew, baggage, cargo) and prevent unnecessary delays.

Section I: Development and implementation of facilitation provisions

- States: increase efforts to implement Annex 9 SARPs
- States: give due regard to Doc 9984 (PWD Manual)
- Council: ensure Annex 9 is current
- Council: ensure Doc 9303 remains up to date



Section II: Security and integrity of traveller identification & border controls

- 5 elements of traveller identification & border management*
- States: implement a robust identification management system
- States: ensure non-MRP expiration date falls before
 24/11/2015 *
- all States urged to join ICAO PKD *
- States to provide input to Interpol's Stolen & Lost Travel Document Database



Section III: National and international action and cooperation on facilitation matters

- States: establish national facilitation committees*
 work together to solve problems
- Participation in electronic data interchange systems
- Use by States of EDI: passenger data requirements conform to international standards
- Handling & clearance of air cargo; security of the international supply chain

- <u>A35-12</u>: Protection of the health of passengers and crews and prevention of the spread of communicable disease through international air travel

2. ANNEX 9: BRIEF HISTORY

Annex 9 developed:

→ elaborate States' obligations under Articles 22, 23, 24

→ standardize procedures for meeting legal requirements under Articles 10, 13, 14, 29, 35



FAL/1 (1946) & FAL/2 (1948) -> Annex 9, 1st Ed.: 25 March 1949 FAL/3 to FAL/11 (1995) \rightarrow Annex 9, 2nd Ed. to 10th Ed. →Annex 9, 11th Ed. (2002) FAL Panels 1 – 3 [FALP/4] & FAL/12 (2004) → Annex 9, 12th Ed. (2005) →Annex 9, 13th Ed. (2011) FAL Panels 5 and 6 FALP/7 (2012) \rightarrow Amendment 24

2. ANNEX 9: SARPs MEANING - Standard

Any specification, the uniform observance of which has been recognized as practicable and as **necessary** to facilitate and improve some aspect of international air navigation, which has been adopted by the Council pursuant to Article 54 (I) . . , and in respect of which non-compliance must be **notified** by Contracting States . . . in accordance with Article 38.



– Recommended Practice

Any specification, the <u>observance</u> of which has been recognized as generally practicable and as <u>highly</u> <u>desirable</u> to facilitate and improve some aspect of international air navigation, which has been adopted by the Council pursuant to Article 54 (I) . . ., and to which Contracting States will <u>endeavour to</u> <u>conform</u> in accordance with the Convention.

CH 1. DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1. <u>Definitions</u>: Meanings of terms used in the Annex

▶ e.g., Admission, Commencement of journey, Deportee, Improperly documented person, Inadmissible person, Person with disabilities, Travel document, etc.

2. <u>General Principles</u>:

► Apply throughout the Annex (e.g. 1.1: SARPs shall apply to all categories of aircraft operation unless specifically mentioned; 1.4: Use of IT)

► Apply specifically to cargo (e.g. 1.3: Use of risk management for release/clearance of goods).



CH 2. ENTRY AND DEPARTURE OF AIRCRAFT

- A. General
 - e.g. Prevention of entry of aircraft: public health reasons
- B. Documents: Requirements & Use
 - e.g. Acceptance of electronic documents; Gen Dec, Pax & Cargo Manifests
- C. Correction of documents
- D. Disinsection of aircraft
 - Use chemical/non-chemical methods and insecticides: WHO
- E. Disinfection of aircraft
- F. Arrangements: General aviation & other non-scheduled flights

 \blacktriangleright Prior authorization & Advance notification \rightarrow AIPs



CH 3. ENTRY AND DEPARTURE OF PERSONS AND THEIR BAGGAGE

- Travel documents (Passports, Visas, etc.), their Security & Inspection
 - → Machine Readable Travel Documents (MRTDs)
 - → Standards 3.10, 3.10.1*
- Inspection of travel documents
- Departure procedures from a State
- Entry procedures into a State; responsibilities of State & aircraft operators
 - \rightarrow API & PNR*



CH 3. ENTRY AND DEPARTURE OF PERSONS AND THEIR BAGGAGE

- Transit procedures (Direct transit areas, Direct transit (airside) visas)
- Baggage separated from its owner
- Crew Member Certificates (Doc 9303, Part 3)
- Civil Aviation Inspectors
- Emergency assistance/entry visas in cases of *force majeure*



CH 6. INTERNATIONAL AIRPORTS — FACILITIES AND SERVICES FOR TRAFFIC

- Provisions of Annex 9 to be implemented in the event an airport becomes privatized.
- Customs, immigration, quarantine and health border clearance services, as required, are provided at international airports.
- Doc 9636: airport signage
- Facilities to be provided to permit embarkation and disembarkation
- Facilities required for aircraft parking & servicing
- Control channels for clearance of outbound/inbound passengers
- Storage, cargo & mail facilities; Unruly passengers; Passenger amenities . . . Etc.



CH 7. LANDING ELSEWHERE THAN AT INTERNATIONAL AIRPORTS

Assistance to an aircraft that has landed elsewhere than at one of a State's international airports: Control formalities kept to a minimum.

 \rightarrow Short stop-over \rightarrow No resumption of flight

CH 8. OTHER FACILITATION PROVISIONS

- Facilitation of search, rescue, accident investigation and salvage
- Implementation of international health regulations
- Communicable disease outbreak national aviation plan *
- Establishment of national facilitation programmes *
- Facilitation of the transport of PWDs *
- Assistance to aircraft accident victims and their families

- Operator; Flight no.; Places of departure & arrival

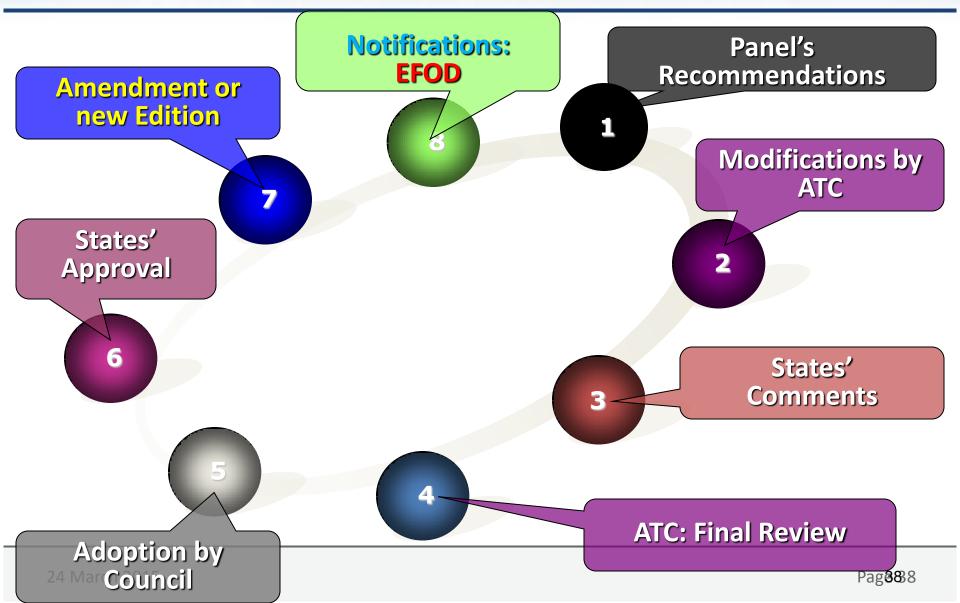
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ANNEX-AMENDMENT PROCESS

<u>Art. 37</u>: ICAO required to adopt and amend, from time-to-time, SARPs . . . (j) Customs & immigration procedures . . .

<u>Art. 54 (I)</u>(*Mandatory functions of Council*): The Council shall: . . . Adopt SARPs . . .

<u>Art. 90</u>: 2/3rds vote; effective 3 months after submission to States unless majority disapprove

Article 38: *Departures from international standards and procedures*

. . . In the case of amendments to international standards, any State which does not make the appropriate amendments to its own regulations . . shall give notice to the Council within sixty days of the adoption of the amendment to the international standard . . .

→<u>Standards: conditional binding force</u> unless differences filed under Art. 38

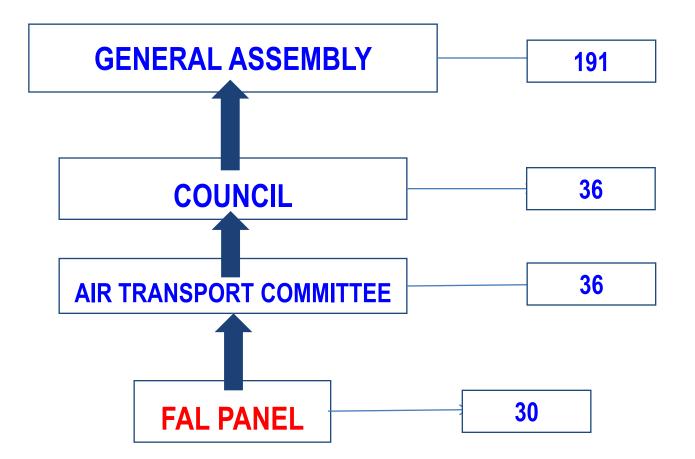

- <u>FALP/6 (2010)</u>: API; Revision of health SARPs (H1N1); Emergency assistance: *force majeure* (Icelandic volcano eruption)
- <u>FALP/7 (2012)</u>: API & PNR; Inadmissible persons & Deportees; PWDs SARPs + New Manual
