







- Aircraft-related technology development
- Improved air traffic management and infrastructure use
- More efficient operations
- Market-based measures (MBMs)
- Sustainable alternative Fuels







States' Action Plans to reduce aviation CO₂ emissions

• For States

Opportunity to identify and communicate measures to address CO2 emissions from international aviation as well as any assistance needs to implement the measures



• For ICAO

Assess the global progress towards the achievement of aspirational goals and address specific assistance needs of States.






States' Action Plans – ICAO Capacity Building Programme

- ICAO Guidance Document on the Development of States' Action Plans (Doc 9988)
- ICAO Interactive Web-Interface APER website
- Hands-on Training seminars in all ICAO Regions
- Over 200 Teleconferences and Meetings with States' Focal Points
- Support provided by ICAO Regional Offices and Technical Cooperation Bureau





States trained up to September 2014







74 States, representing around 82% international RTK, submitted a first action plan as of September 2014



74 States submitted an Action Plan by June 2014

Remaining States





APAC Seminar October 2014

- 12 States from APAC Region participated
- Presentations from 6 States from the region on planned updates to their Action Plans – sharing information and best practices
 - Wide range of measures being explored
 - All States working to <u>quantify</u> their expected results and re-submit by June 2015





States' Action Plans - Key Achievements

- 99 States trained, 160 States contacted by phone, 74 States' Action Plans submitted.
- Substantial support and engagement by States in developing Action Plans in a short time
- Many synergies for action generated Involvement of different actors
- Improvement of the knowledge and experience acquired

States are invited to update and submit their action plans to ICAO once every three years.





More support needed

However there are needs for:

- Further training of new State Focal Points
- Translation of material, guidance, tools, etc. in all languages
- More assistance to States


Support from States:

- Ensure retention of knowledge within the DGCAs (less HR rotation)
- Voluntary funding earmarked for the Action Plan/Assistance to States initiative





ICAO's work on Assistance



ICAO's work on Assistance







ICAO – UNDP – GEF Project

- Objective: To provide assistance to developing countries and Small Islands Developing States (SIDS) in reducing aviation emissions
- ICAO developed a Project Identification Form (PIF)
- PIF approved by GEF in 2013
- 50,000 USD allocated to develop Project Description Document
- 2 Million dollars assistance project











Conclusions

- ICAO Work priorities on environment are:
 - State action plans and assistance
 - Sustainable alternative fuels for aviation
 - Market-based Measures (MBMs)
 - Global aspirational goals
 - CO2 Standard expected to be developed by 2016; and
 - work in cooperation with other UN bodies in particular in support to the UNFCCC process
- Climate change will remain the main challenge on the ICAO environmental activities in the upcoming years.




