Education: A graduate of the National Polytechnic Institute of Mexico

(1965), Mr. Kobeh González holds an Engineering degree in Communications and Electronics. He was a professor of Aeronautical Electronics at the Institute from 1972 until 1975. He also studied at the Federal *Aviation Administration Academy* in Oklahoma and at the *National Productivity Centre of Mexico* and has taken several management, planning, quality assurance

and leadership courses.



Awards:

Mr. Kobeh González received the Award for Extraordinary

Service from the Federal Aviation Administration of the United States in 1988. In 1997, he was awarded the Emilio Carranza Medal from the Government of Mexico for his contribution to the development of civil aviation in Mexico for thirty consecutive years. In 2004, he received the award for Contribution to the Development of Aviation in the Central American Region from the Central American Corporation for Air Navigation Services (COCESNA). In 2009, he received the degree of Doctor of Engineering Honoris Causa from the Korea Aerospace University. In 2010, the President of the United Mexican States awarded him the Lázaro Cárdenas Prize, the highest award presented by the National Polytechnic Institute to distinguished graduates. In 2011, he was awarded the title of Doctor Honoris Causa by the Turkish Aeronautical Association University. In 2012, at the IATA FIDAE Wings of Change Conference 2012 held in Chile, he was presented with the Galería Aeronáutica Latinoamericana (GALA) Award for his Distinguished Service in Latin American Air Transport. He also received the Peace Medal Award from the President of Mongolia, and was honoured with an award from Airports Council International - Latin America and the Caribbean (ACI-LAC) for his extensive experience in aviation activities and his support to the world aviation industry. In 2013, the Government of Burkina Faso bestowed on Mr. Kobeh the Médaille d'Officier de l'Ordre national for his extensive experience in aviation activities, exceptional leadership, multiple presences in Africa to promote the improvement of civil aviation in the Continent, and for his strong support of the AFI Plan. Upon his retirement, in December 2013, the Council of ICAO conferred on Mr. Kobeh the honorary title of "Lifetime Goodwill Ambassador of ICAO" in recognition of his outstanding contribution to international civil aviation.
