EASA is the preferred partner from the EC for aviation-related TA

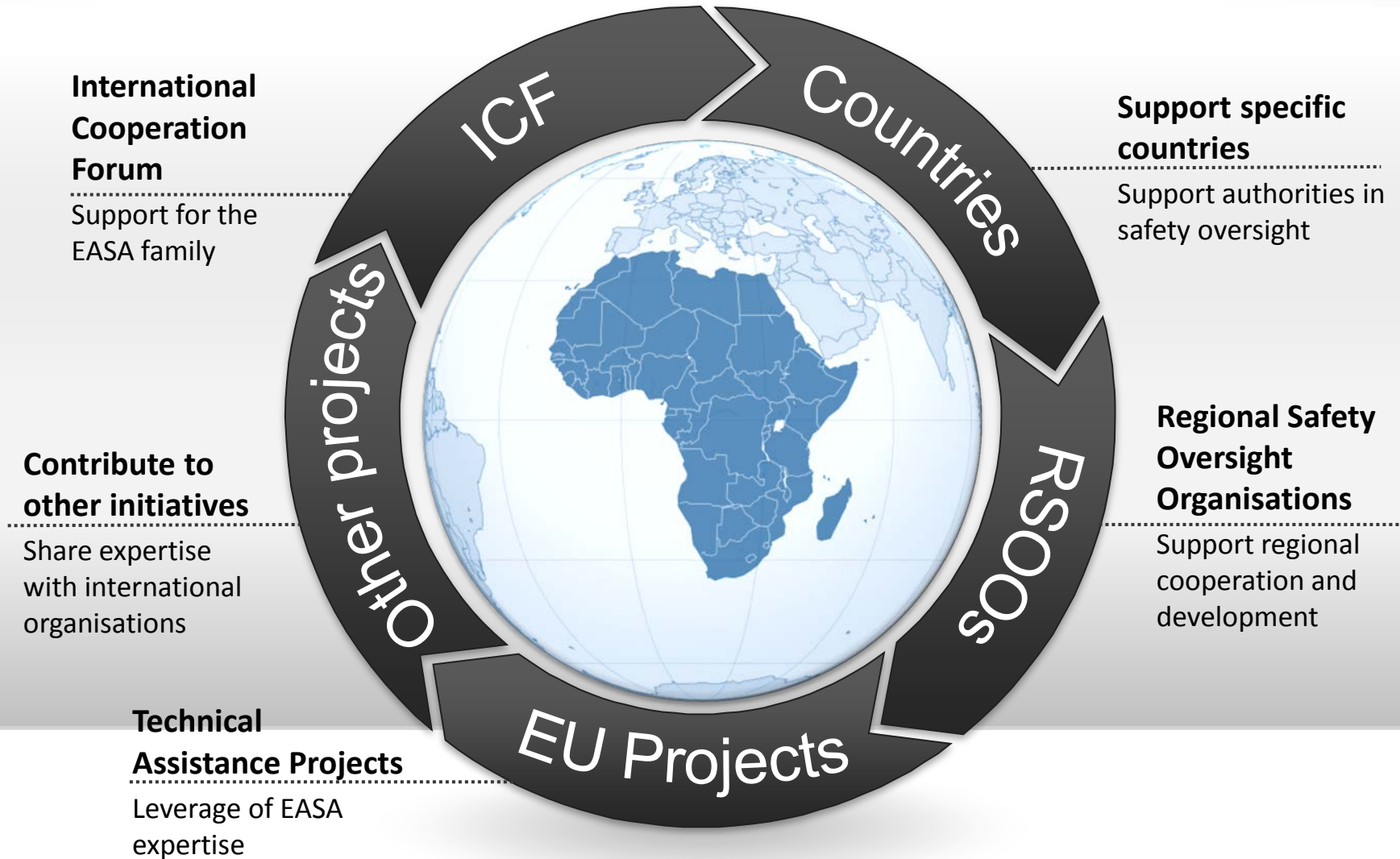


In the AFI region, EASA is

EASA Structure



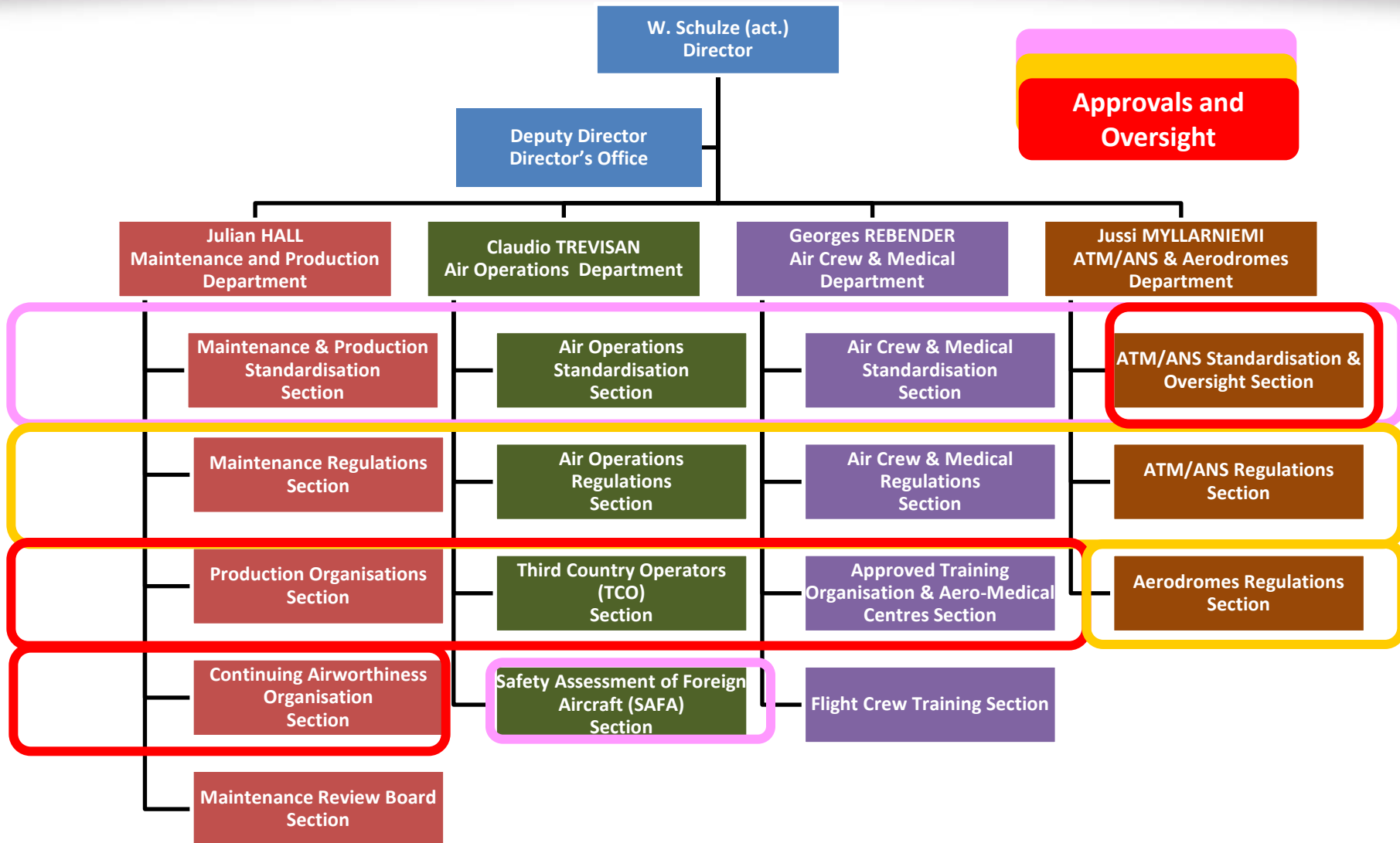


EASA structure as of
