EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Working Paper presents information related to the status of Implementation of the 2020 AFI SECFAL Plan Work Programme; State Specific Projects as approved; and implementation of the 9th SC Meeting Decisions and Recommendations. The Working Paper also presents for consideration and approval, of the Plan Work Programme and Projects for 2021

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 This paper contains information related to the status implementation of the AFI SECFAL Plan Work Programme and State Specific Projects for the year 2020 (**Attachment A**), Status of implementation of the 9th SC Meeting decisions and recommendations held virtually on 28th July 2020 (**Attachment B**), and 2021 Plan work programme (**Attachment D**).

1.2 Support activities to States in the 2021 Work Programme are based on the tasks required to implement the priority State Specific Projects as approved by the SC. The development of the priority projects was also informed by the needs assessment and analysis undertaken by the Plan secretariat. Furthermore, the work programme includes the Long-term (2021-2023) tasks, and those related to the implementation of the revised Windhoek targets as aligned with the Global Aviation Security Plan (GASeP) and those carried over from Plan Mid-term (2018-2020) programme. The challenges occasioned by the COVID-19 pandemic, prompted the delays and setback in completing some of the activities.

2. DISCUSSION

2.1 The Ninth Meeting of the SC held virtually on 28th July 2020 reviewed the progress in the implementation of 2019 Plan work programme and retrospectively approved the 2020 work programme. Despite the circumstances and restrictions imposed by States due to COVID-19, the Plan

activities as approved including the carried over tasks and implementation of the SC Decisions and Recommendations has continued though remotely.

2.2 Priority was given to the assistance and support to States efforts to implement the Recommendations in the ICAO Council Aviation Recovery Task Force (CART), the African Union High-Level Task Force on Post-COVID-19 Recovery Strategy for the African Civil Aviation Sector. As mandated, the secretariat and the Chairperson of the SC have provided the necessary briefing and update of the progress to ICAO Secretary General and the ICAO Council.

2.3 To harness synergies the plan has concentrated on enhancing the existing coordination and collaboration mechanism amongst Plan partners and stakeholders at national and regional level. Taking advantage of the improved online platforms and the aggressive ICT development the plan has embraced the usage of remote methodologies and tools to conduct activities such as webinars, workshops and meetings.

2.4 In recognition of declaration of 2021 as the Year of Security Culture, appropriate activities were generated by the Plan to ensure effective sensitization of the concept as a GAsEP pillar. The emphasis of activities is on promotion of security culture agenda.

2.5 Other areas of focus include assisting the State efforts to strengthen border controls, enhancing risk awareness and assessment, improving aviation security oversight and quality control activities, establishment of sustainable Plan funding mechanism and the development and implementation of priority projects based on urgent needs to support recovery from COVID-19 pandemic impact.

2.6 Since the last SC meeting, several achievements have been made notable of which include:

- a) The remote assistance and implementation of the AFI SECFAL Plan work programme, supporting the implementation of Windhoek Declaration and Targets as aligned with the (GAsEP). All Activities have been conducted virtually or remotely due to Covid-19 travel restrictions.
- b) The State Specific Projects for Angola and Djibouti halted in 2020 due to COVID-19 pandemic and related restrictions have been reactivated and supported remotely. The Angola project was completed in June 2021 with the intended objectives of augmenting the regulatory framework being achieved. Djibouti project is ongoing, with its first phase completed in June 2021. Due to various security, political and COVID-19 reasons, the onsite activities of project for Central African Republic (CAR) and Guinea Bissau remain inactive and, however remote support is ongoing.
- c) It is worth noting that the support activities for the two SSeC States requires onsite mission if the project objectives are to be attained. It is also anticipated that onsite missions will be necessary for validation mission in one of the SSeC States once the restrictions are eased and physical activities are possible. It is imperative that alternative methods be innovatively explored to enable conduct of the subject validation exercise.
- d) As a mitigation measure to the curtailment of onsite missions for support activities, the Regional Office has developed a remote support tool to support the implementation of USAP -CMA Corrective Action Plans. During the period, fourteen States have been supported remotely including Zimbabwe, Botswana, Rwanda, Uganda, Namibia, Chad, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Gambia, Guinea and Sao Tome, Senegal, Comoros, and Mozambique.
- e) The Plan has enhanced the remote monitoring of the implementation of the Windhoek targets and implementation of CART recommendations and the associated “Take-off” guidance through implementation packages (iPacks) for the Restart and the Resilience of Civil Aviation. So far, Malawi, the Gambia, Sierra Leone and Eswatini have received sponsorship under ICAO TCB initiative for the iPacks. Further, training and awareness has also been provided through webinars.

- f) Following introduction of limited scope USAP-CMA activities, six States (Botswana, Gambia, Gabon, Senegal, Togo, and Rwanda), have undergone remote audits and significant progress has been posted towards attaining the GASeP 2020 targets-(80% of States to achieve 65% average EI). Despite the low full USAP-CMA activities due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the current AFI overall average EIs has increased from **59.71% in 2020 to 61.66% in 2021**. Notwithstanding the low USAP CMA activities to validate States progress, the cumulative improvement since inception of the Plan is **53.06 % in 2015 to 61.66%** as at June 2021.
- g) Following the operationalization of the AFI Security and Facilitation Collaborative Experts Scheme (CES), under the auspices of the African Civil Aviation Commission (AFCAC) in 2020, induction workshops to enhance capacity of the experts and guarantee effective execution of onsite support tasks resumed in 2021. The AFI CES was established to provide assistance to States through sharing and using experts from within AFI region.
- h) In collaboration with the ICAO Secretariat and relevant UN Agencies, the Plan has provided continuous support to the African Union Commission (AUC) and AFI States towards the development of the African e-passport in support of the free movement of people policy under the AUC agenda 2063. It is hoped that the issuance of the African e-passport will further promote the implementation of the Advance Passenger Information (API) and Passenger Name Record Data (PNR) systems.
- i) Since November 2020, the membership to ICAO Public Key Directory (PKD) has increased from **3 to 14 States** in the AFI region and four States are in the final stages to join the ICAO PKD. In coordination with ICAO HQ, Airports Council International (ACI), the European Union (EU) International Organization for Migration (IOM) and the United Nations Counter Terrorism Executive Directorate (UNCTED) joint efforts are being undertaken to enhance implementation of API/PNR.
- j) In support to the recovery from the impact of the COVID-19, four priority projects will be undertaken in 2021 through the funding allocated by the ICAO secretary amounting to **CAD 553,000**. Voluntary funding amounting to USD 150k from Saudi Arabia and 100K is to be allocated from Qatar voluntary contribution under ICAO IVF framework. In addition to the CAD 553K, the ICAO Council approved the allocation of **CAD 500,000 being** carry over from 2020 to be utilized for identified Plan activities between 2021 and 2023.
- k) As mandated by the programme document, the ICAO Secretary General and SC Chairperson presented oral reports to the ICAO Council. Furthermore, the SC Chairperson made a detailed presentation to the Informal briefing to Council on the status of implementation of the Plan, its achievements, challenges and future priorities. Highlighted in all presentations was the need to establish a sustainable Plan funding mechanism under the ICAO Regular budget.
- l) The Plan has initiated four priority activities including support to CART Recommendations Implementation, Facilitation Course; E-learning platform (restricted access and inspector recurrent training); ICAO TRIP strategy awareness and implementation workshop. Of the intended 500 AFI Region experts to benefit from the Course, 43 experts from Ethiopia, Kenya, South Africa, Ghana, Nigeria and Liberia received training in June 2021.

2.7 With regard to the status of implementation of the 9th SC Meeting Decisions and Recommendations, several actions have been taken under remote assistance and support framework. Details of the implementation status are highlighted in **Attachment B** and the Plan secretariat will continue to provide updates on the implementation status at every SC Meeting.

2.8 The COVID-19 pandemic and related restrictions has posed enormous challenges to the AFI SECFAL Plan and to large extent aggravated the long-standing inherent issues in the pursuit to attain the objectives of the Plan. Constraints of inadequate aviation infrastructure to enable effective compliance with ICAO SARPs, and delayed implementation of Windhoek and GASeP targets and relevant UN Security Council Resolutions (UNSCR) on aviation security and border controls continue to prevail.

2.9 Additional key challenges to the Plan include lack of sustainable funding to support the implementation of the work programme, priorities and ongoing State Specific Projects; slow pace by states to implement the UNSCRs on border control, including operationalization of API and PNR systems and joining the ICAO PKD. Other major impediments include weak political will to aviation in general, and legislative challenges in some States.

2.10 The voluntary financial and in-kind contributions and pledges offered by States and Partners, continue to be inadequate to support the Plan activities. As of 30th June 2021, the Fund balance is CAD 304k (excluding the CAD 553k allocated by the ICAO Secretary General). The 2021 budget estimates for the Plan were revised to reflect the funds allocated by the Secretary General to implement the 2021 priority activities. The revised budget estimates amounting to USD 1,260,000 are being presented for retrospective approval. Details of the financial statement, the priority projects budget estimates and the budget estimates are in **Attachment C**.

2.11 Considering the need to prioritize the Plan activities within the context of COVID-19 situation, while maintaining the continuous execution of the AFI SECFAL Plan objectives, the secretariat included activities to mitigate some of the challenges in the 2021 Work Programme (**Attachment D**). The work programme includes, all the activities and projects not completed in 2020, tasks related to implementation of the decisions and recommendations of the 9th SC Meeting that yet to be fully completed, and Year of Security Culture (YOSC) activities (2021). In addition, included are Long Term Plan activities (2021 -2023) and roll-out of the relevant ICAO CART implementation Packs (i-Packs) to mitigate the adverse impact of COVID-19 crisis to aviation security and facilitation.

- g) Commend States, ICAO Council and Partners for the continuing to support the AFI SECFAL Plan, in terms of advocacy, provision of both human and financial resources; and,
- h) Recognize the contribution made by the outgoing ICAO Secretary General Dr Fang Liu and her support to the AFI SECFAL Plan since inception.
