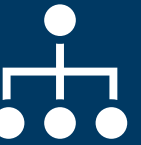

- The Under-Secretary-General provides strategic leadership to United Nations counter-terrorism efforts

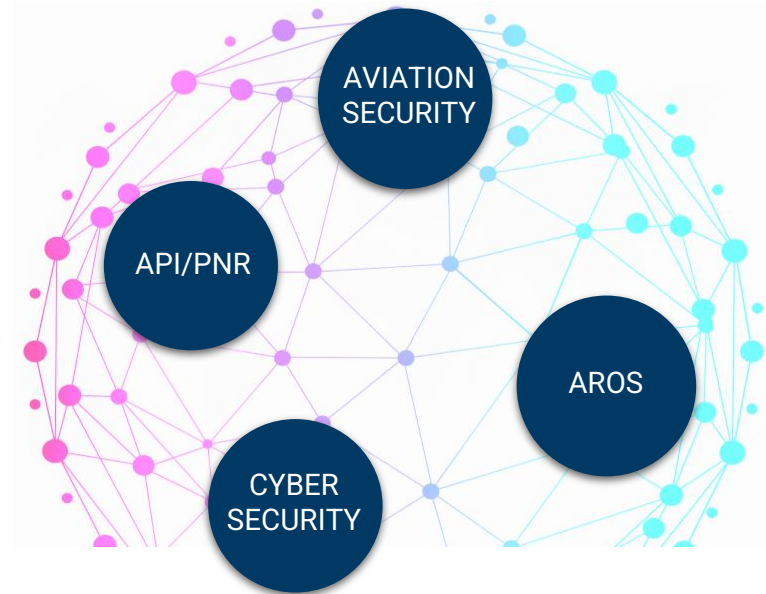
COORDINATION AND COHERENCE

CAPACITY BUILDING

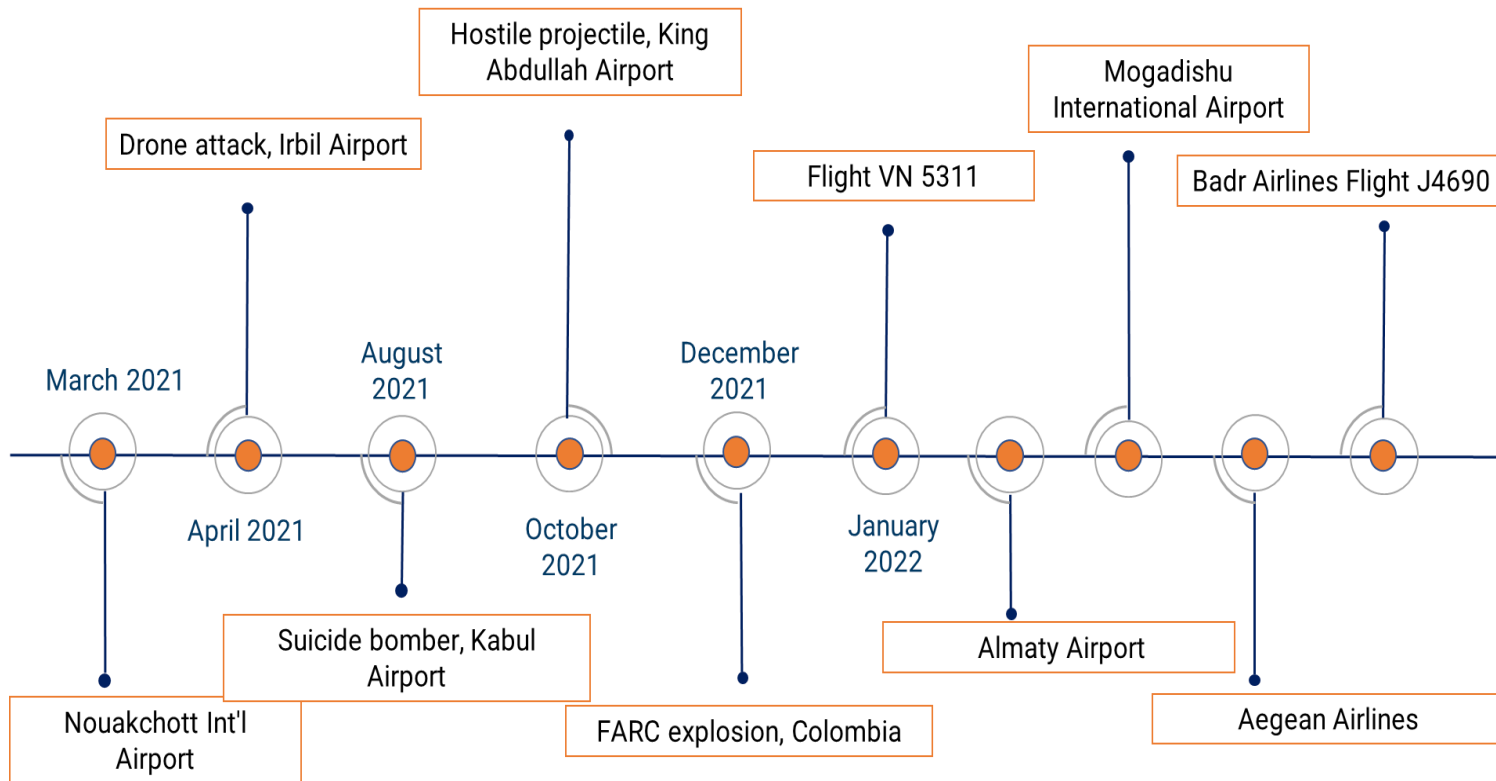

SNAPSHOT

Mission

- Develops and tests a **national** interagency information-sharing **framework**;
- Enables transmission of relevant terrorist threat information from the **information holders** (counterterrorism agencies) to the **aviation security decision makers** (aviation security agencies);
- Helps Member States implement timely, **risk-based** aviation security measures.

Programme Milestones

- September 2021 - tied with 20th Anniv. of 9/11
- February 2022: **Botswana** successfully completes implementation
- Q3 2023: **West Africa** Regional Workshop
- Q4 2023: **Nigeria** to complete Programme

- **Collaboration:** CTED, **ICAO**, INTERPOL, UNODC
- **Duration:** December 2023; Currently forward planning

UN Countering Terrorist Travel Programme

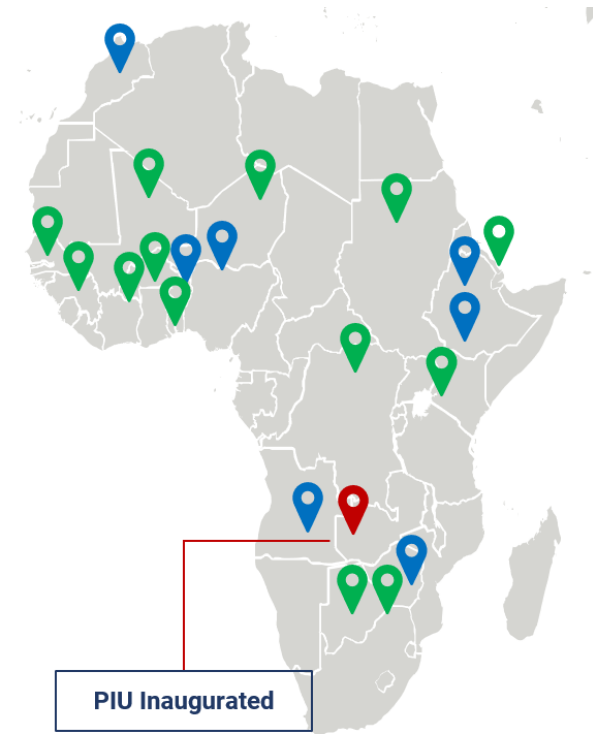

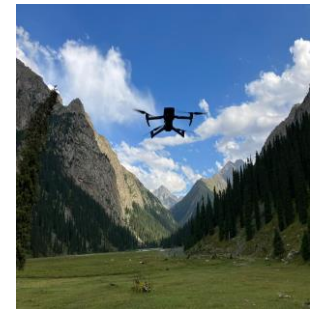
