Art. 10: Aircraft to land at <u>designated</u> customs airport for customs & other examination

<u>Art. 13</u>: Passengers, crew, cargo: compliance with laws on entry, clearance, immigration, passports, customs, quarantine

Art. 14: State to take measures to prevent the *spread of disease*



Art. 22: Each Contracting State agrees to adopt all practicable measures . . .

- to facilitate & expedite navigation by aircraft . . . & to prevent unnecessary delays to aircraft, crews, passengers and cargo
 - → especially in the administration of the laws relating to immigration, quarantine, customs & clearance.

→"Facilitation of formalities"



<u>Art. 23</u>: State to establish C & I procedures in accordance with practices recommended (by ICAO) [► Art. 37]

Art. 24: (a) Aircraft admitted free of duty

(b) Fuel, oils, spare parts, regular equipment and stores exempted from customs duty, etc.

Art. 29: Documents carried in aircraft: . . .

- (d) journey log book [Gen Dec acceptable];
- (f) passenger manifest;
- (g) cargo manifest



- Art. 35: Cargo restrictions:
 - (a) No munitions/implements of war;
- (b) Other restrictions for public order or safety

Article 37

(Adoption of International Standards and Procedures)

1.Each State undertakes to collaborate in securing. . . uniformity . . . regulations, standards . . . facilitate & improve air navigation.

Question: "What is facilitation"?

Facilitation is the efficient management of border control processes to expedite clearance (of aircraft, passengers/crew, baggage, cargo) and prevent unnecessary delays.

2. ANNEX 9: B. SARPS MEANING

Standard



Any specification, the uniform observance of which has been recognized as practicable and as **necessary** to facilitate and improve some aspect of international air navigation, which has been adopted by the Council pursuant to Article 54 (I) ..., and in respect of which **non-compliance** must be notified by Contracting States . . . in accordance with Article 38.

2. ANNEX 9: B. SARPs MEANING

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Recommended Practice

Any specification, the **observance** of which has been recognized as generally practicable and as highly desirable to facilitate and improve some aspect of international air navigation, which has been adopted by the Council pursuant to Article 54 (I) . . ., and to which Contracting States will endeavour to conform in accordance with the Convention.

CH 1. DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1. <u>Definitions</u>: Meanings of terms used in the Annex

▶ e.g., Admission, Commencement of journey, Deportee, Improperly documented person, Inadmissible person, Person with disabilities, Travel document, etc.

2. General Principles:

► Apply throughout the Annex (e.g. 1.1: SARPs shall apply to all categories of aircraft operation unless specifically mentioned; 1.4: Use of IT)

► Apply specifically to cargo (e.g. 1.3: Use of risk management for release/clearance of goods).



CH 2. ENTRY AND DEPARTURE OF AIRCRAFT

- A. General
 - ▶ e.g. Prevention of entry of aircraft: public health reasons
- B. Documents: Requirements & Use
 - ► e.g. Acceptance of electronic documents; Gen Dec, Pax & Cargo Manifests
- C. Correction of documents
- D. Disinsection of aircraft
 - ► Use chemical/non-chemical methods and insecticides: WHO
- E. Disinfection of aircraft
- F. Arrangements: General aviation & other non-scheduled flights
 - ► Prior authorization & Advance notification → AIPs



CH 3. ENTRY AND DEPARTURE OF PERSONS AND THEIR BAGGAGE

- Travel documents (Passports, Visas, etc.), their Security & Inspection
 - → Machine Readable Travel Documents (MRTDs)
 - → Standards 3.10, 3.10.1*
- Inspection of travel documents
- Departure procedures from a State
- Entry procedures into a State; responsibilities of State & aircraft operators



CH 3. ENTRY AND DEPARTURE OF PERSONS AND THEIR BAGGAGE

- Transit procedures (Direct transit areas, Direct transit (airside) visas)
- Baggage separated from its owner
- Crew Member Certificates (Doc 9303, Part 3)
- Civil Aviation Inspectors
- Emergency assistance/entry visas in cases of *force* majeure



CH 6. INTERNATIONAL AIRPORTS — FACILITIES AND SERVICES FOR TRAFFIC

- Provisions of Annex 9 to be implemented in the event an airport becomes privatized.
- Customs, immigration, quarantine and health border clearance services, as required, are provided at international airports.
- Doc 9636: airport signage
- Facilities to be provided to permit embarkation and disembarkation
- Facilities required for aircraft parking & servicing
- Control channels for clearance of outbound/inbound passengers
- Storage, cargo & mail facilities; Unruly passengers; Passenger amenities . . . Etc.



CH 7. LANDING ELSEWHERE THAN AT INTERNATIONAL AIRPORTS

Assistance to an aircraft that has landed elsewhere than at one of a State's international airports: Control formalities kept to a minimum.

→ Short stop-over

→ No resumption of flight

CH 8. OTHER FACILITATION PROVISIONS

- Facilitation of search, rescue, accident investigation and salvage
- Implementation of international health regulations
- Communicable disease outbreak national aviation plan *
- Establishment of national facilitation programmes *
- Facilitation of the transport of PWDs *
- Assistance to aircraft accident victims and their families



<u>Art. 37</u>: ICAO required to adopt and amend, from time-to-time, SARPs . . . (j) Customs & immigration procedures . . .

Art. 54 (I)(Mandatory functions of Council):

The Council shall: . . . Adopt SARPs . . .

Art. 90: 2/3rds vote; effective 3 months after submission to States unless majority disapprove


Article 38: Departures from international standards and procedures

. . . In the case of amendments to international standards, any State which does not make the appropriate amendments to its own regulations . . shall give notice to the Council within sixty days of the adoption of the amendment to the international standard . . .

→ <u>Standards: conditional binding force</u> unless differences filed under Art. 38
