PHASE 2: Developing a PHECP

- □ The development of a Public Health Emergency Contingency Plan (PHECP) for MMIA Lagos was formally initiated at an inter-agency stakeholders meeting held on 8th March, 2016.
- ☐ ProHealth International (PHI), a US CDC-funded NGO based in Nigeria facilitated the development of the PHECP.
- ☐ A Core Planning Team (CPT) for the development of the plan was formed with membership drawn from the various stakeholders (including PHS, NCAA, FAAN, NAMA, Airlines, Ground Handling, Security agencies).
- ☐ PHI/PHS & NCAA served as facilitators/secretariat.

PHASE 2: Developing a PHECP

- ☐ Core Planning team drew up a work plan
- **☐** Met once every fortnight
- ☐ A Six months' time line was agreed for the completion of the plan
- ☐ Stakeholders were updated on the status of the devt. of the plan on a monthly basis
- ☐ Stakeholders input(s) were welcomed and incorporated










PHASE 5: Preparatory Meetings (contd.)


- **☐** The inter-agency preparatory meetings culminated in the following:


