Introduction – The Basis for High Level Task Force on COVID-19



AU Bureau of Heads of State and Govt -3 April 2020

Underscored the need for a comprehensive & coordinated continental approach

Established continental Ministerial Committees coordinate

Reiterated the need for concrete & rapid financial support

Called for a comprehensive stimulus package for Africa AU Bureau of Sub-Committee on Transport -23 April 2020

Approved continental ministerial coordination committees

Supported the appeal by AUC Chairperson to support African civil aviation

Adopted the COVID-19 recovery proposal by AUC & AFCAC African Directors General of Civil Aviation

> Supported the need for HLTF under the coordination of AFCAC

Recommended development of a comprehensive Strategy AUC, AFCAC, ICAO Regional Offices & African aviation Stakeholders - April 2020

Established the HLTF.

Aligned the HLTF to CART principles


Developed 15 Recommendations EX1 to EX15 grouped under;

Follow-ups by AFCAC on Status of Implementation of HLTF

AFCAC-CAAS Directors-General Roundtable for aviation restart.

AFCAC in collaboration with the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) co-hosted three (3) DGs Roundtable discussions entitled:-

- Balancing public health needs against aviation sector health;
- Safety oversight and safe return to operations;
- Safeguarding aviation security and facilitation.

The 3 roundtables were developed for DGs to give their experiences on implementation of HLTF recommendations and to raise questions, challenges, issues and opportunities relating to decision making on public health, safety, security & facilitation matters resulting from the on-going efforts to restart aviation operations during this COVID-19 period.



Follow-ups by AFCAC on Status of Implementation of HLTF

AFCAC-CAAS Directors-General Roundtable for aviation restart.

As an outcome of the 3 roundtable webinars, it was observed that during the COVID-19 era, public health institutions were leading Governments when it comes to making key health related decisions in all sectors and this has caused occasional conflicts due to other competing demands such as economic, safety and security requirements for the aviation industry.

It was agreed though that there is need for collaboration amongst key stakeholders to balance public health requirements against economic, safety, security and facilitation requirements.


Based on the online AFCAC Questionnaire

Implementation Status of HLTF




HLTF RECOMMENDATIONS LEVEL OF IMPLEMENTATION BY RECOMMENDATION

Discussions and Way Forward - HLTF



- □States to continue to review their operations, provide response and updated data to AFCAC for better policy and technical support.
- □States and their respective airlines to take advantage of the US\$ 3 billion set aside by Afreximbank for commercial financing to entities significantly impacted by Covid-19.
- □ AfDB is also another potential avenue to access funding based on commercial terms i.e, require State guarantees, particularly for those airlines whose States are existing bank clients.



Discussions and Way Forward - HLTF

- □ African States are encouraged to establish national plans that will ensure that COVID-19 restart and recovery measures for the African Aviation industry as proposed by the AUC and other stakeholders are timely implemented.
- □ The HLTF Report and ICAO CART guidance document recommends measures aimed at strengthening aviation public health, confidence among passengers, aviation workers and the general public, while minimizing negative operational and efficiency impacts.
- □ CAAs need to embrace IT Tools through use of contactless technologies to ensure public health and safety and the optimum use of depleted numbers of technical personnel & CAA inspectors and apply relevant risk based safety oversight techniques.
