Jeffrey Wool is the *secretary general* of the *Aviation Working Group (AWG)*, a not-for-profit international industry group that works on the development of policies, regulations and rules designed to facilitate advanced international aviation financing and leasing. AWG, chaired by Airbus and Boeing, includes the world's major manufacturers, leasing, and financial institutions. Jeffrey acts in that capacity on secondment from *Blake*, *Cassels & Graydon*, New York.

Jeffrey is the condon-falkner professor of global business law at the *University of Washington School of Law*. He is also an associate member of the *University of Oxford* Faculty of Law and a senior research fellow at Harris Mancester College, Oxford. He is the *president* of the UNIDROIT Foundation.

Jeffrey has been centrally involved, on behalf of AWG, in the development of various international aviation and commercial law instruments, including negotiation, and national ratification / implementation, of the Cape Town Convention (CTC). He chaired the group that prepared the initial draft of the Aircraft Protocol, chairs the International Advisory Board for the CTC's International Registry, and is the executive director of the Oxford – UW CTC academic project. He now leads a global project promoting and assessing compliance with CTC.

Jeffrey is a co-author of *Transnational Commercial Law* (2nd ed., Oxford University Press, 2012). He is the specialist editor of the academic version of the book, dealing with the relationship between commercial law treaties and national law.
