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Asia-Pacific

- Meeting logistics – participants & hosting country
- Low level of development of core capacities to implement IHR
- No formal collaborative agreements
- Poor inter-sectoral coordination, collaboration and communication



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Asia-Pacific

- Insufficient resources
- No public health emergency plans
- Inadequate training programmes



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AFI

- Communication and collaboration not well developed in some States
- WHO and ICAO collaborative effect to be enhanced at the Regional, sub-Regional and national level
- Communication, Collaboration, Coordination and Cooperation between Civil aviation and public health to be improved through Agreements



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AFI

- States are to implement core capacities and WHO temporary recommendations during a PHEIC
- Funding remains a challenge



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Americas

- Formal agreement between ICAO and WHO
- Joint article with ICAO on CAPSCA for the WHO Bulletin or a peer review Medical Journal
- Access to funding
- Update the Airport Emergency Planning Manual



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Americas

- Understanding CAPSCA impact and benefits
- Future CAPSCA activities format
- Participation (PAHO representative, CAA, neighboring States) in national exercises
- Training programmes
- Collaboration
- Resources



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Americas

- Interoperability of relevant sectorial plans
- Continuity in spite of the rotation of officers
- Reconsideration of the project based on evolution and experience
 - management mechanisms
 - methodological approach
 - additional development of the tools
 - scope extension
- Legal aspects consideration



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Americas

- Dissemination of contact details e.g. Dangerous Goods
- Extension of programme – chemical emergencies, radiation, etc.
- Technical advisors - activities and responsibilities



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Europe

- Not priority – seen as project, not programme
- Administrative processes within Organizations
- Limited resources
- Refine SOPs & undertake table-top (partial or full scale) Public Health Emergency (PHE) exercises
- Sharing of best practices and lessons learned



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Europe

- Development of a sustainable training/learning system
- IHR capacity development
- Shorten the timeline for retrieving information
- Improve the quality of information
- All relevant stakeholders to be involved in developing the content of NOTAMS

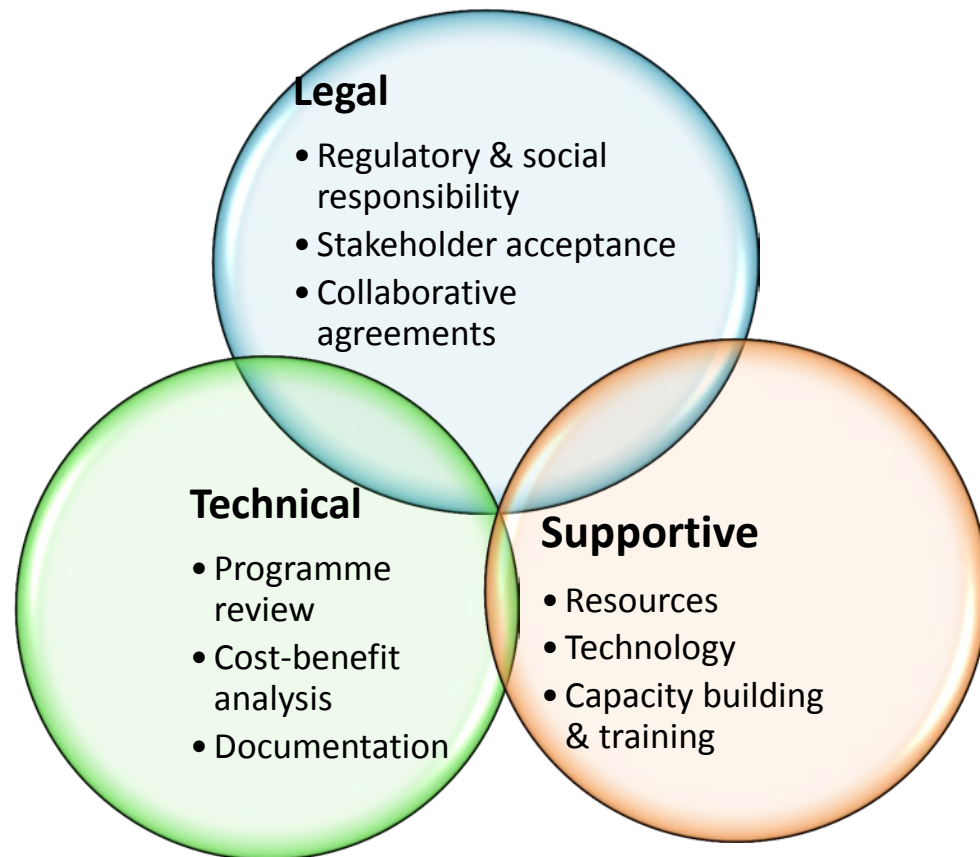
