• 4.4.2 Each Contracting State shall ensure that transfer passengers .. and ..cabin baggage are screened prior to boarding an aircraft, unless it has established a validation process and continuously implements procedures, in collaboration with the other Contracting State where appropriate, to ensure that such passengers and their cabin baggage have been screened to an appropriate level at the point of origin ...




OSS Indirect Benefits > Direct Benefits

- Direct Benefit
 - Screening cost and time saved
- Indirect Benefits
 - Fewer missed connections
 - Fewer delays
 - Better utilization of airport capacity
