- At present, the Airport Clinic is operated by the Ministry of Health and is located at the departure area (level6.0) opposite to gate12B

- Furthermore, the upcoming slides are some examples of Public Health Incidents at BIA during 2018







Nipah Virus

- Close coordination took place between the Airport Clinic & the Public Health Directorate – MoH
- Additional medical team was available on duty 24/7 to handle & treat all flights arriving from an infected destination
- Thermal Scanners were installed at arrival (L2.8) as there was a spread of Nipah Virus (Pandemic Influenza)
- Manual Nipah temperature screening took place at Gate 12B to ensure each passenger arriving from an infected destination was examined.


