





The Arab Economy Will Grow in 2021, but Not to 2019 Levels




International Connectivity of the Arab Market is Way Below 2019 in 2021




Transit Traffic Still Around 90% Less than Pre-crisis Levels



Travel Demand is Expected to Remain Weak During H1-2021





The Arab economy will not recover to pre-pandemic levels before 2022, which will affect the recovery of travel and tourism

02

If the current situation persists, passenger traffic will remain weak during the first half of 2021. Flexibility of measures is needed

03

Passenger traffic is expected to reach prepandemic levels in a period of 4 to 7 years, depending on various factors including vaccination, easing of restrictions, economic recovery, government support, and the use of technology in travel

04

Further government support is needed. Also, applying measures that are risk-based and harmonized with other countries is essential for the recovery of the travel and tourism sector to overcome this crisis and continue to play its role as a socio-economic catalyst
