11. Pass port and Visa requirements

It is required a valid Passport for all citizens and Visa for citizens of certain countries. For this end it is requested that participants carry out all formalities **timely** in order to obtain the Mexican Visa before departure.

12. Business and Bank hours

Business hours are: Monday to Saturday from 8:00 a 18:00 hours.

From 9:00 to 16:00 hours Monday to Friday. There are some agencies

working until 19:00 hours

ATM network is available 24 hours, but it is highly recommended to avoid their use during late hours.

13. Taxes and Tips

All purchases in Mexico are subject to a 16 % tax named IVA, the same which is included in the final Price. In Mexico tip is optional, due to its inclusion within the final Price, however is used to tip the bellboy with one US Dollar per bag and 10% from a restaurant bill

14. Transportation

There are five suggested means of transportation in Mexico City:

a) Taxi

It is recommended to use radio taxis, from your Hotel taxi site or any taxi site provided by your Hotel.

b) Metro

Total cost of a single trip is MXN 5.00, Hours of operation are: Monday to Friday from 5 to 24 hours, Saturdays from 6 to 24 hours, and Sundays and bank holidays 7 to 24 hours.

For your comfort and safety avoid peak hours in the main lines, between 8:00and 10:00 in the mornings and between 17:00 and 20:00 in the evenings.

c) Microbús

This mean of transport is recommended for short trips only or where there is no other form of transport. They usually have their destination in a sign placed on the lower right part of the windscreen, and prices vary from MXN6 to 7.

d) Metrobús

In order to use this service you will have to purchase an electronic card, it costs MXN 16.00 and includes the cost of the card (MXN 10.00) and a single trip (MXN 6.00). The service to the Airport cost MXN 30.00.

e) Car Rental

You can get a car from one day with a limited mileage, to a weekly or a monthly plan with unlimited, costs vary depending on the brand, model and plan.

Bank notes have various **Security Elements** to prevent falsification. Some of them can be detected by the senses like touch or sight, others require special devices.

Security Elements on the paper and polymer bank notes are the following::
