

Frédéric LEGRAND
African Flight Procedure Programme (AFPP) Manager, ICAO

Mr. Frédéric Legrand is the Manager of the African Flight Procedure Programme (AFPP), an ICAO Programme launched in June 2014 and hosted in Dakar, Senegal by ASECNA.

Born in 1955, he obtained a Degree in Science in 1976 before entering the Ecole Nationale de l'Aviation Civile (ENAC) in Toulouse, France. He is married with one daughter. He holds a private pilot's license.

He joined the French DGAC in 1977 as an Air Traffic Controller where he held several positions in En Route, Aerodrome, Approach and Radar Control Centers in metropolitan and overseas France. In 1999, he moved to ENAC then Toulouse-Blagnac Air Traffic Control Center to manage training of ATCOs Instructors. He joined in 2006 the DGAC Research and Development Division as an expert in ATC in order to coordinate activities related to ACAS/TCAS incident reports and ATCOs training, as well as development of future ASAS applications.

In 2009, he was appointed as Head of Air Traffic Control Center in Guadeloupe, French West Indies before joining ICAO in 2013.

Frederic was a member of national and international working groups, regarding implementation of sustainable development in air navigation (noise abatement for flight procedures and CO2 emissions reduction), English Language Proficiency Test for ATCOs for DGAC France and ASECNA (PELA), and EUROCONTROL (ELPAC) and participated to studies about development of ASAS applications (ATSA, ASPA and ASEP) in AP23, joint FAA/EUROCONTROL working group.
