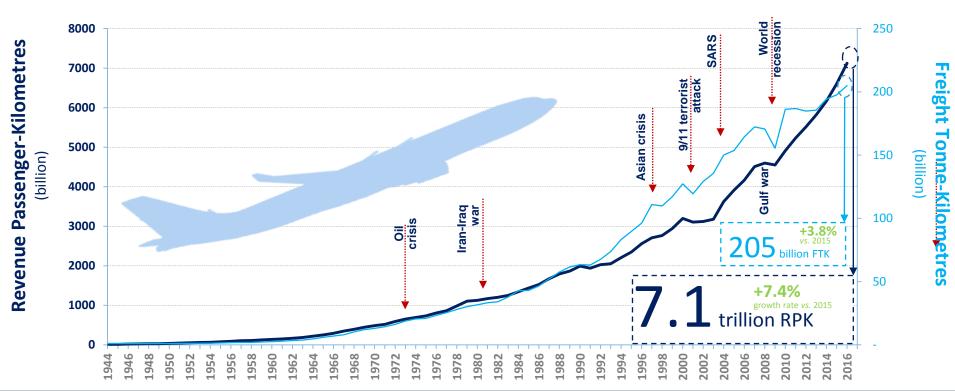








Growth of air transport







The size of the industry 2016

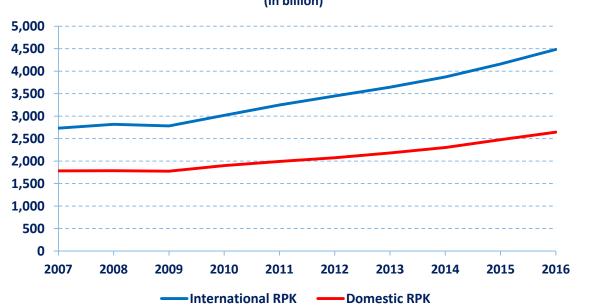
- 3.8 billion passengers

Domestic and International Revenue Passenger-Kilometres (RPK) (in billion)

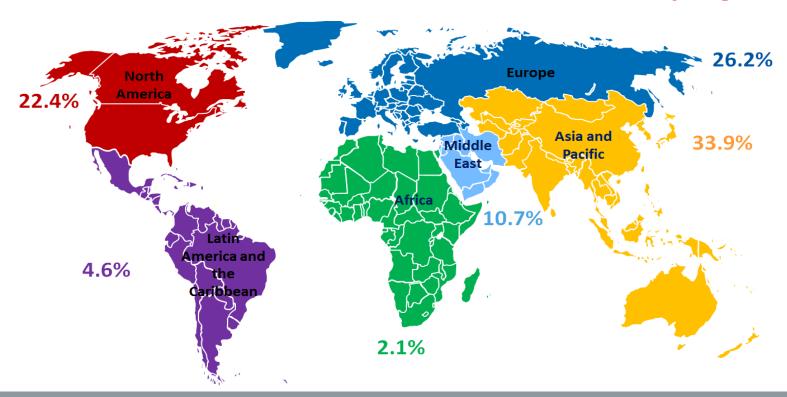

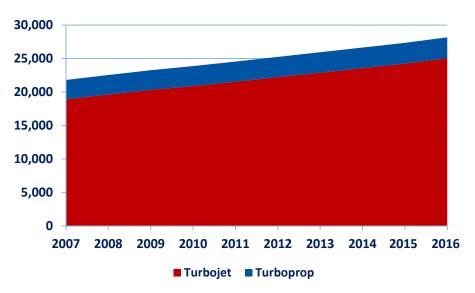

Airline fleet

Commercial fleet evolution



For the 2 largest aircraft manufacturers (Airbus and Boeing) in 2016:

- 1520 new aircraft delivered
- Net orders for 1555 aircraft

Book to bill ratio = orders / deliveries

Book to bill ratio sharply declined from **1.3:1** in 2015 to **1:1** in 2016, reflecting slowing orders to deliveries.

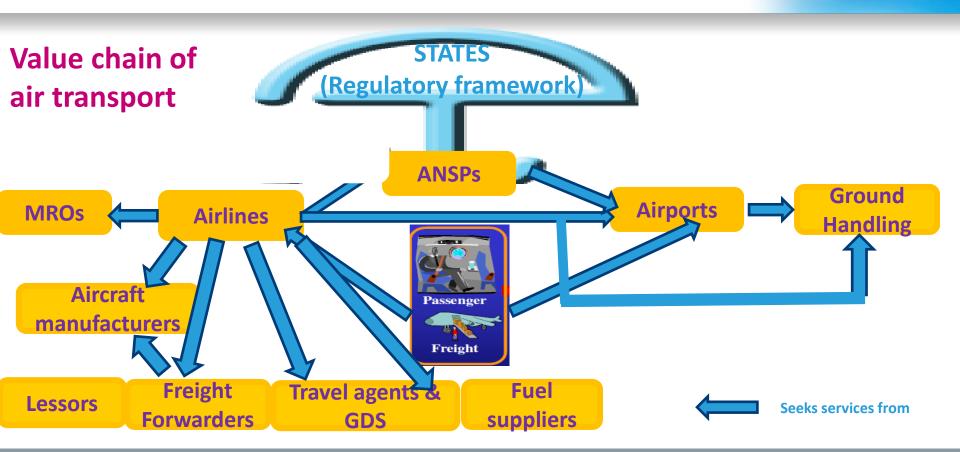

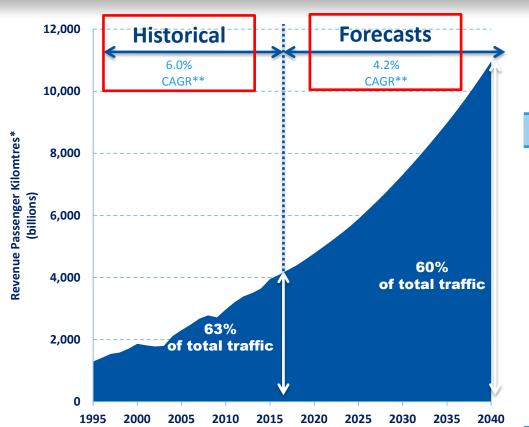

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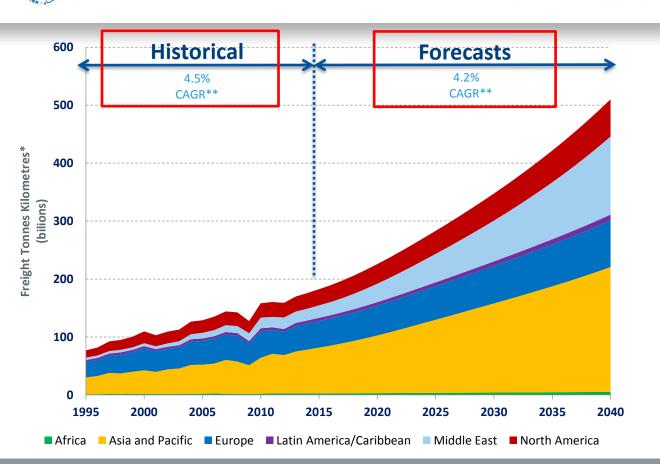

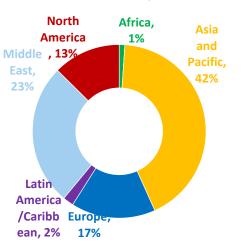
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Long-term air traffic forecasts Scheduled international freight traffic

Projected International Freight Traffic Breakdown by AOC 2040



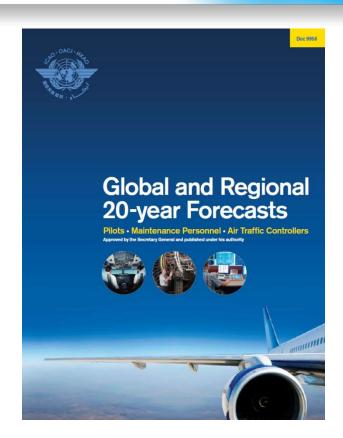




39th Assembly Outcome regarding Personnel Forecasts

Report on the Development of a single set of harmonized long-term forecasts (A39-WP/64)

Update global and regional 20-year forecasts for pilots, maintenance personnel and air traffic controllers (DOC 9956) in April 2018 to meet the needs of the ICAO Next Generation Aviation Professional (NGAP) programme.







Aviation Data and Analysis Panel met in March 2017

The Panel recommended that:

- a) the Secretariat should continue its work in the development of the forecast of licensed aviation professionals within the timeline proposed and with the help of the MDWG-LTF and the TFGs; and
- b) the Secretariat should consider other sources of information available, which can supplement existing ICAO data and results of the survey.

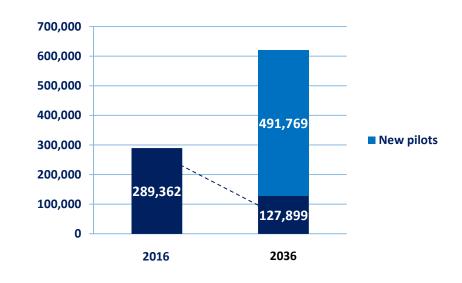

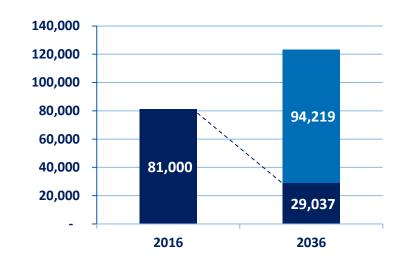

Maintenance personnel forecasts for 2036

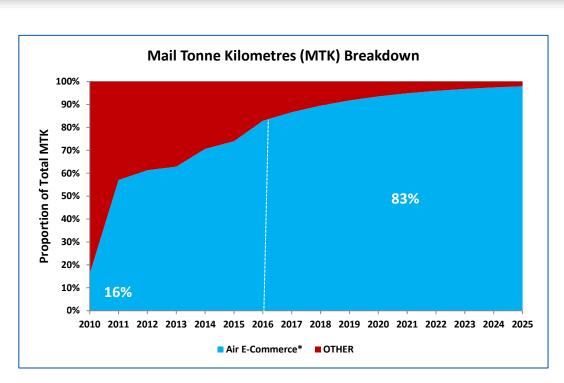
1.3 million maintenance personnel required in 2036

Maintenance personnel population includes personnel employed by commercial air transport operators, maintenance, repair and overhaul organizations (MROs) and training organization.



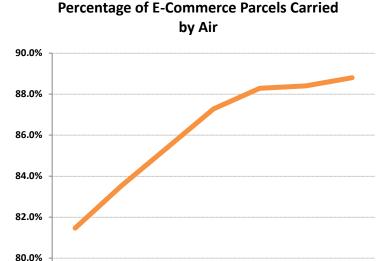
