


1. NAM DAF MUN MARKET

Namdaemun Market is the largest traditional market in Korea with over 10,000 stores that line the streets around Namdaemun Gate, the main southern gate of the old city wall.

The market is known for selling every product imaginable, including clothing and textile products, everyday items, kitchenware, handicrafts, accessories, imported goods, food, miscellaneous items, farm and fishery products, and much more to wholesale and retail customers.

Food Alleys

There are a lot of food alleys in Namdaemun Market, where Wangmandu (Giant dumplings), Yachae hotteok (Vegetable pancakes), Kalguksu (Noodle soup) and Galchijorim (Braised cutlass fish) are especially popular.

2. CHEONG GYE CHEON STREAM

This is a 10.84KM-long stream flowing from Gwanghwamun square to Dondaemun. In 2005, it was transformed into an ecological stream after a restoration project that took 3 years. Visitors can take a stroll down the walking path along the Cheonggyecheon and enjoy the night view at the stream & 22 bridges that shine under fantastic lighting. The Seoul Lantern Festival is held here for 2 weeks in Nov featuring thousands of lanterns along the stream.



MUST SEE ATTRACTIONS

GWANGHWAMUN SQUARE 광화문광장

This 555-meter-long, 34-meter-wide square is in front of Gwanghwamun, the starting point of stream. Statues of Admiral Yi Sunshin and King Sejong, two of the most respected historical figures in Korea, are situated in Gwanghwamun Square.





JONGMYO SHRINE 종 묘

Jongmyo is the supreme state shrine where the ancestral tablets of deseased kings and queens of the Joseon Dynasty are enshrined and was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1995. Jongmyo Jerye, the memorial service offered every May since 1464, is one of the oldest ancestral rites held today, and was designated by UNESCO as Masterpieces of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity in 2001.

WHERE TO EAT

MIRAE ASSET CENTER1 미래 에셋 센터원

Located in the center of stream and their *Center1 Avenue* have various kinds of restaurant. The famous place is *Gosang* (Temple food), *Slow Brew Pub* 느린마을 양조장 (Brew rice wine shop), and there are more choices on their fine & casual dining place.



3. GYEONG BOK GUNG PALACE

Gyeongbokgung Palace was the first royal palace built in the Joseon Dynasty and is where the Joseon Dynasty's 500-year history began. This palace provides a glimpse into Joseon's royal culture and palace life. You can learn more about the royal culture & historical living conditions of Koreans at the National Palace Museum of Korea & National Folk Museum of Korea, which are located in the palace.

The event you should not miss is the "Royal Guard Changing Ceremony", the guard's splendid costume are a real pleasure to see.


TOSOKCHON 토속촌 삼계탕






4. SAM CHEONG DONG & BUK CHON HANOK VILLAGE

Traditional Korean houses and modern buildings exist side-by-side, creating unusual scenes. Contemporary restaurants and wine bars have been established in traditional houses along with galleries, designer shops, specialty shops and themed museums.

This district between Gyeongbokgung Palace and Changdeokgung Palace is packed with over 900 Hanoks, traditional Korean houses. Member of the royal family and aristocrats lived here during the Joseon Period. It retains the city's old appearance; thus, it has become a popular filming location for movies and TV dramas. As it is still a residential area, visitors are requested to be respectful of residents.



MUST SEE ATTRACTION

MMCA SEOUL 국립현대미술관

The National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Seoul (MMCA Seoul) opened on Samcheong-dong Street, which is also known as the "Culture Street" in Nov 2013. MMCA Seoul is an art and culture complex equipped with exhibition and education bldg, digital lab, multi-project hall and theater.

MAPLE TREE HOUSE 단풍나무집

Maple Tree House is a premium Korean Barbeque restaurant chain operating in Korea since 2005 and one of the most popular BBQ restaurant for quality meat lovers. You can find this restaurant with beautiful garden, when you walk along the Samcheong-dong street.

5. CHANG DEOK GUNG PALACE 창 덕 궁

Originally built in 1405 as a detached royal villa in the Joseon Dynasty, it is considered the most well-preserved royal residential palace. This palace was inscribed on the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage List in 1997 for its outstanding architecture and a design that is in harmony with the landscape.

6. IN SA DONG

Nowhere exudes more local and traditional charm than Insa-dong, a quaint neighborhood in the center of Seoul that transports visitors back to a time when women wore hanbok and men rode horses. With its wooden tea houses, boutique galleries and street vendors selling traditional snacks, a stroll through Insa-dong is mandatory for all visitors, especially on Sundays when the streets become traffic free and come alive with street performances, buskers and throngs of young and old who have come to experience one of Seoul's most fascinating and creative neighborhoods. While the entertainment here is free, Insa-dong is also one of the best places in Seoul to purchase traditional Korean art, products, and other souvenirs, as it is filled with antique shops, art galleries, traditional stationery shops, handicraft shops, pottery and porcelain shops, bookstores, and art supply stores. Insa-dong is home to many traditional restaurants and tea houses.



MUST SEE ATTRACTIONS

SSAMJIGIL 쌈지길

This is a multi-cultural space where visitors can shop for a wide variety of traditional arts and crafts.

It is one of Korea's most famous Buddhist temples, which have temple stay programs for foreigners. On Buddha's birthday, the lotus Lantern Festival is held in the Jongno and Insa-dong areas and this temple is always the starting point of the parade.

7. MYEONG DONG

Myeong-dong is a shopping destination filled with inexpensive cosmetic boutiques and specialty apparel boutiques. 8. N SFOUL TOWER

N Seoul Tower was built in 1969 as Korea's first integrated transmission tower beaming television and radio broadcasts across the capital. Since opening to the public in 1980, it has become a much-loved Seoul landmark. The tower's main attractions include multi-colored digital art projected onto the tower at night, a digital observatory, a roof terrace, the HanCook restaurant, the n.Grill restaurant, and the Haneul (Sky) Restroom. N Seoul Tower's mountain surroundings on Namsan (Mt.) have made it a popular place to unwind for locals and tourists alike.
