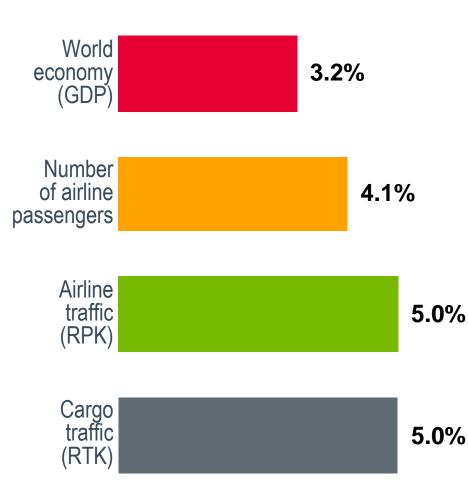

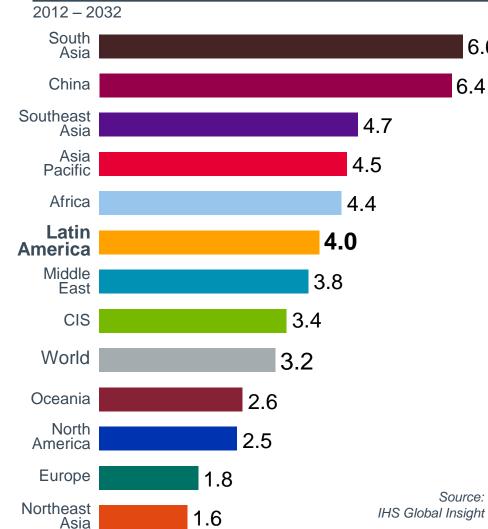

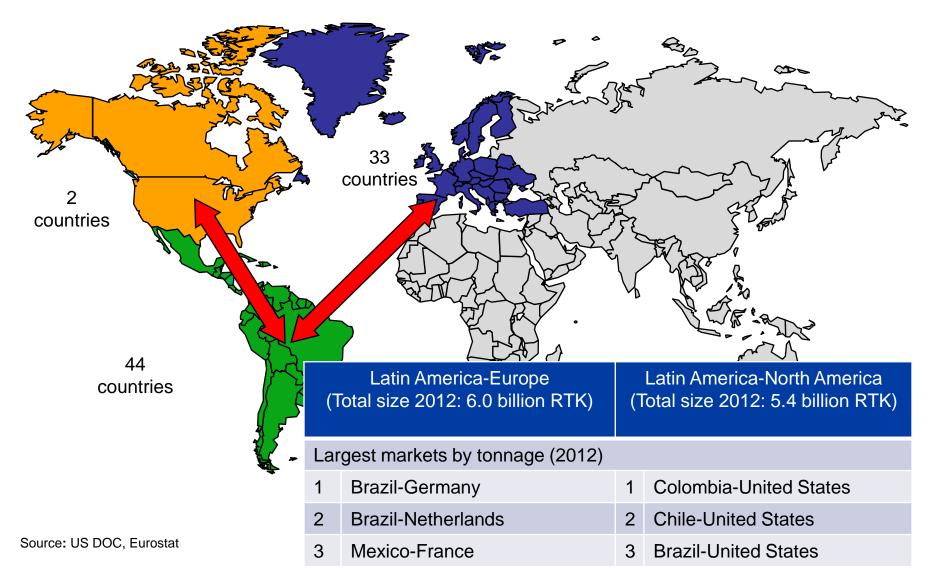

Annual GDP growth

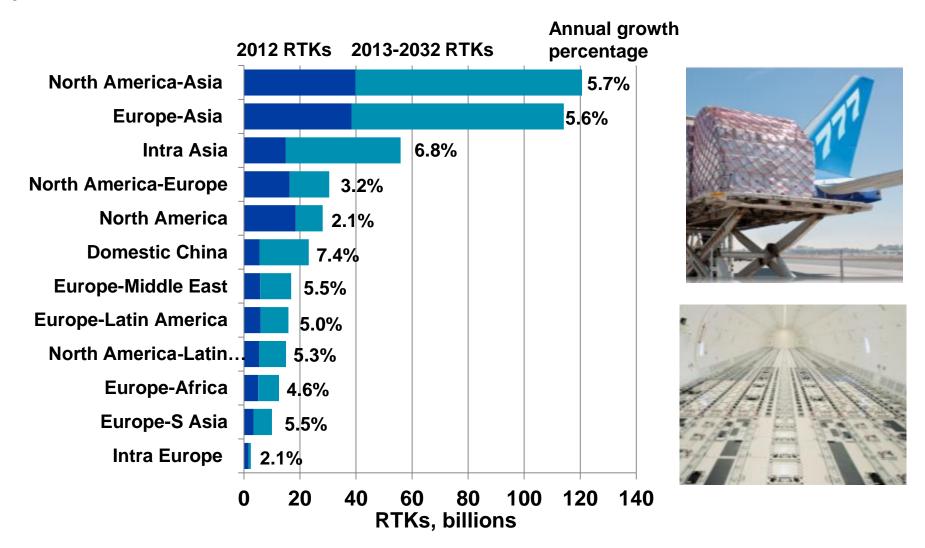




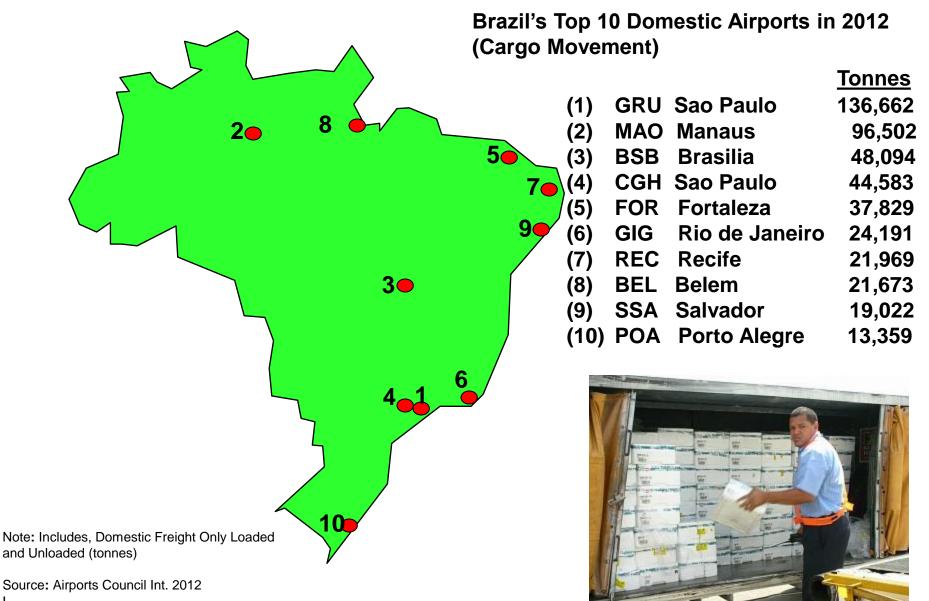
The European and North American air cargo markets are Latin America's largest



World air cargo traffic is forecasted to grow 5.0% per year over the next two decades



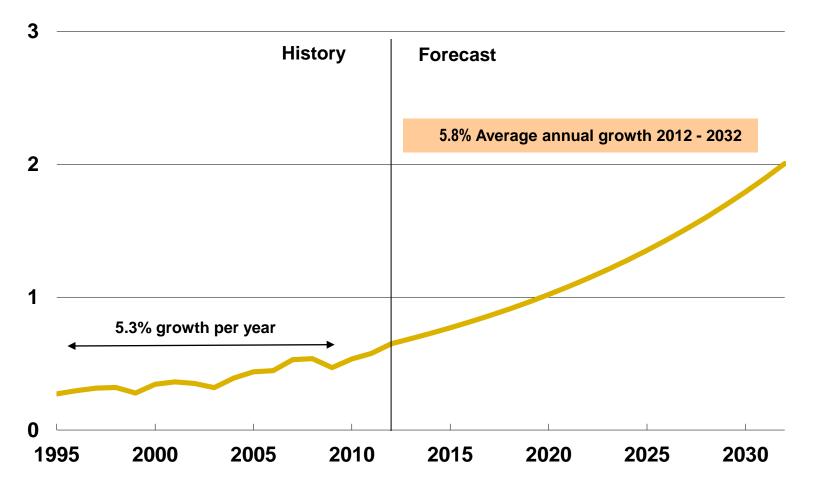
Sao Paulo (GRU) and Manaus are the largest domestic air cargo airports

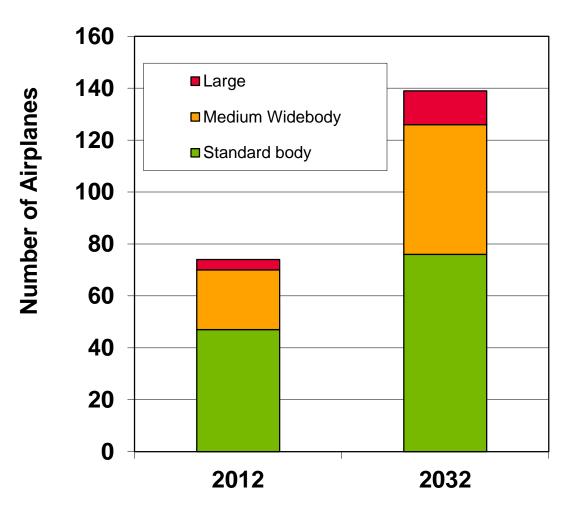

Summary

- Challenging near-term environment
- Economic and trade forecasts point to improvement, at trend in 2014 and beyond
- Long-term air cargo drivers remain strong: imperative for reliability and speed, continuing product innovation, global interdependence
- Annual world GDP and trade growth will continue to drive 20-year world air cargo growth rate of 5% annually
