1. Reaching the Summit – ICAO SARPs and Guidance

- Concepts and ideas found in ICAO's Annex 9 and Doc 9303 represent the "summit"
- Before reaching the summit, concepts/ideas are vetted vigorously by subject matter experts
- For ICAO's Traveler Identification (TRIP) related work, this vetting is done by two complementary working groups:
 - ▶ The New Technologies Working Group (NTWG)
 - The Implementation and Capacity Building Working Group (ICBWG)
 - Honourable Mention the ICAO Public Key Directory (PKD)



2. New Technologies Working Group (NTWG)

Develops and maintains interoperable Machine Readable Travel Document (MRTD) standards related to issuance and document verification, including exploring new technologies.

KEY CONTRIBUTIONS and ACTIVITIES:

- Partnership with International Standards Organization
- Stewardship of Doc 9303 ensuring technical specifications for MRTD security and operational efficiency remain up to date/relevant
- Exploring new technologies (for example, digital travel credential)
 - scoping out future travel document solutions, and
 - developing solutions to address emerging needs



3. *Implementation and Capacity Building* Working Group (ICBWG)

- Provides advice, support and expertise to States related to travel documents and identity
- Supports States' efforts to comply with ICAO SARPs and technical specifications

KEY CONTRIBUTIONS and ACTIVITIES:

- Develops ICAO guidance material
- Provides a forum for sharing of expertise and best practices
- Monitors MRTD technical specifications compliance
- Assesses potential need for changes to existing SARPs, addition of new SARPs (for example, the current *Exploratory Assessment of Annex 9*)



4. Return on Investment of Participation

Becoming part of the community discussing global responses to traveler facilitation trends and challenges

- **there is potential for some elements of these discussions to eventually be advanced as ICAO SARPs, technical specifications or other key bits of global guidance
- Bringing insights gained home, to inform your own states' domestic approaches and decision-making processes
- Knowing which tools are out there to assist with compliance efforts, where to find them, and/or how to access them



Along with **broader member state participation, there is also potential benefit to be derived from increased participation of both **border officials** and **representatives from industry** (via IATA and other industry organizations) in the work of the TRIP Programme.

5. Broader Participation = Stronger, More Relevant ICAO Guidance


