Key ingredients:

- Trust
- Ability to influence outcomes
- Information
- Metrics that present likely impacts on communities in a way that is meaningful and relates to their experiences

Trust

- Challenge is to address perception that:
 - engagement rarely results in positive actions
 - regulators and industry place needs of industry ahead of environmental issues
- Requires greater visibility in the process from regulators
- Access to independent advice evidence suggests that trust develops where industry facilitates access
- Close the loop! Provide feedback on how public comments have been considered and outcomes

Information

- Clarity on why airspace change is being sought e.g. is the primary reason capacity, efficiency, environmental protection?
- Need for consistent presentation of the data
- Provide as much granularity as possible
- Wide publicity: don't limit engagement to known community groups

Metrics

- Less reliance on average noise contours and more specific information about changes to numbers, aircraft types, and times of day/night
- Capable of presenting advantages of respite
- Capture effects of low background noise
- What is the objective? Some decisions show benefits of PBN reducing the number of people affected, but mask the increased impact on those under concentrated flightpaths

Ability to influence the outcome

- Important to seek community views at an early stage
- Provide options
- Not all communities want the same approach (e.g. concentration or dispersal) so need the ability to be flexible
- Do communities have the resources to engage on technical issues?





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
