Mark has been the UK's Chief Air Services Negotiator since 2008. He has led the negotiation of numerous new and updated Air Services Agreements (ASAs) and exchanges of traffic rights. Recently, much of Mark's work has focussed on preparing for the UK's exit from the EU. This has included ensuring that contingency arrangements are in place for all exit scenarios to ensure air connectivity. It has also included negotiating new, bilateral, ASAs to replace EUnegotiated multilateral arrangements — for instance with the USA and Canada.

He is a member of ICAO's Air Transport Regulation Panel and ECAC's Medium-Term Objectives Task Force.

Prior to taking up his current post, Mark accumulated extensive international policy and negotiations experience in rail, road-freight and road-pricing policy. A career Civil Servant, with a background as a Human Resources professional, Mark cut his teeth as a negotiator working hands-on in public sector industrial relations.
