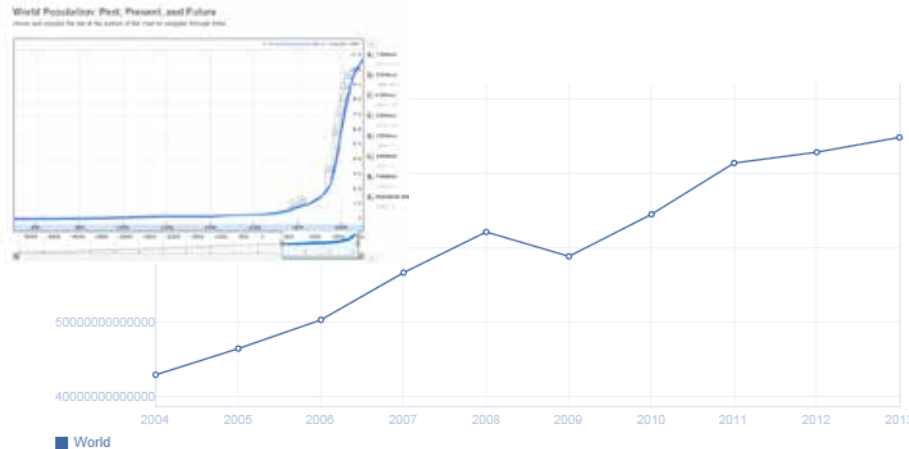


The Reality Today

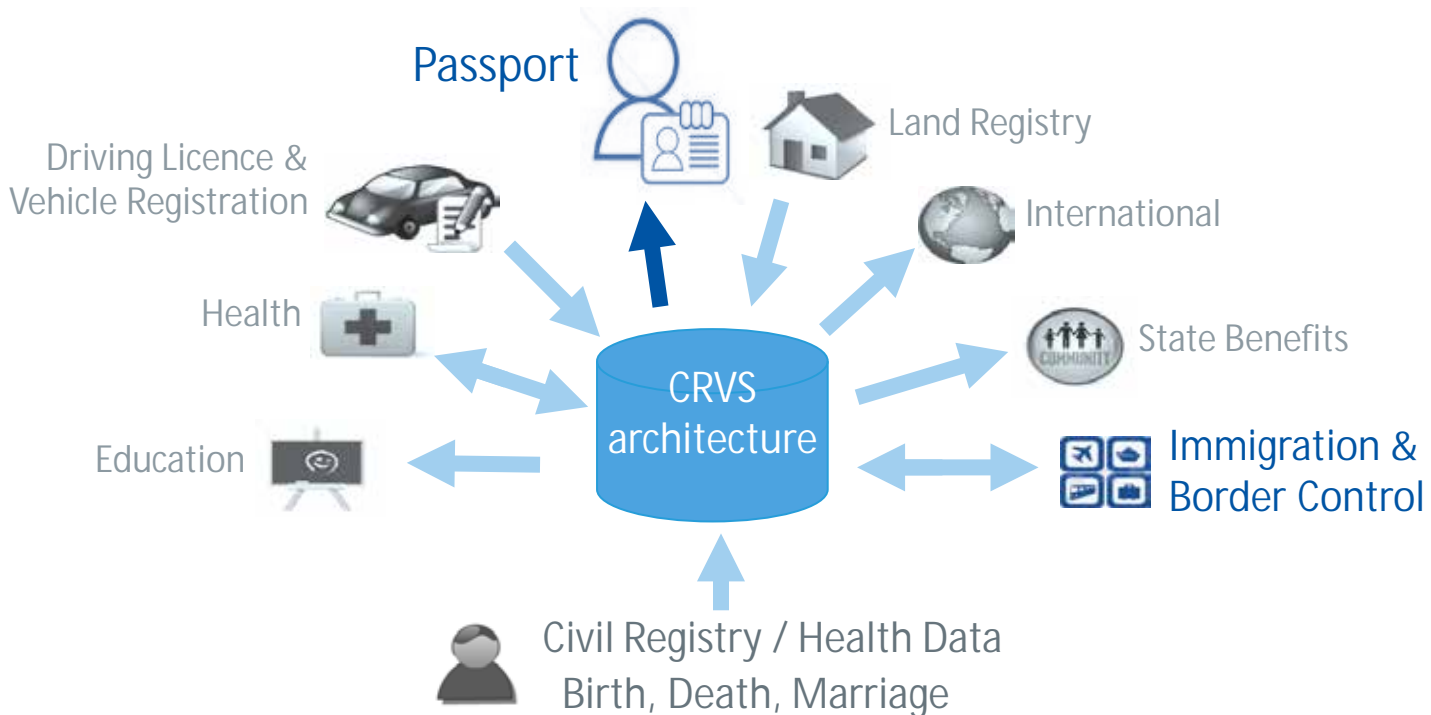

There is a need for universal alignment

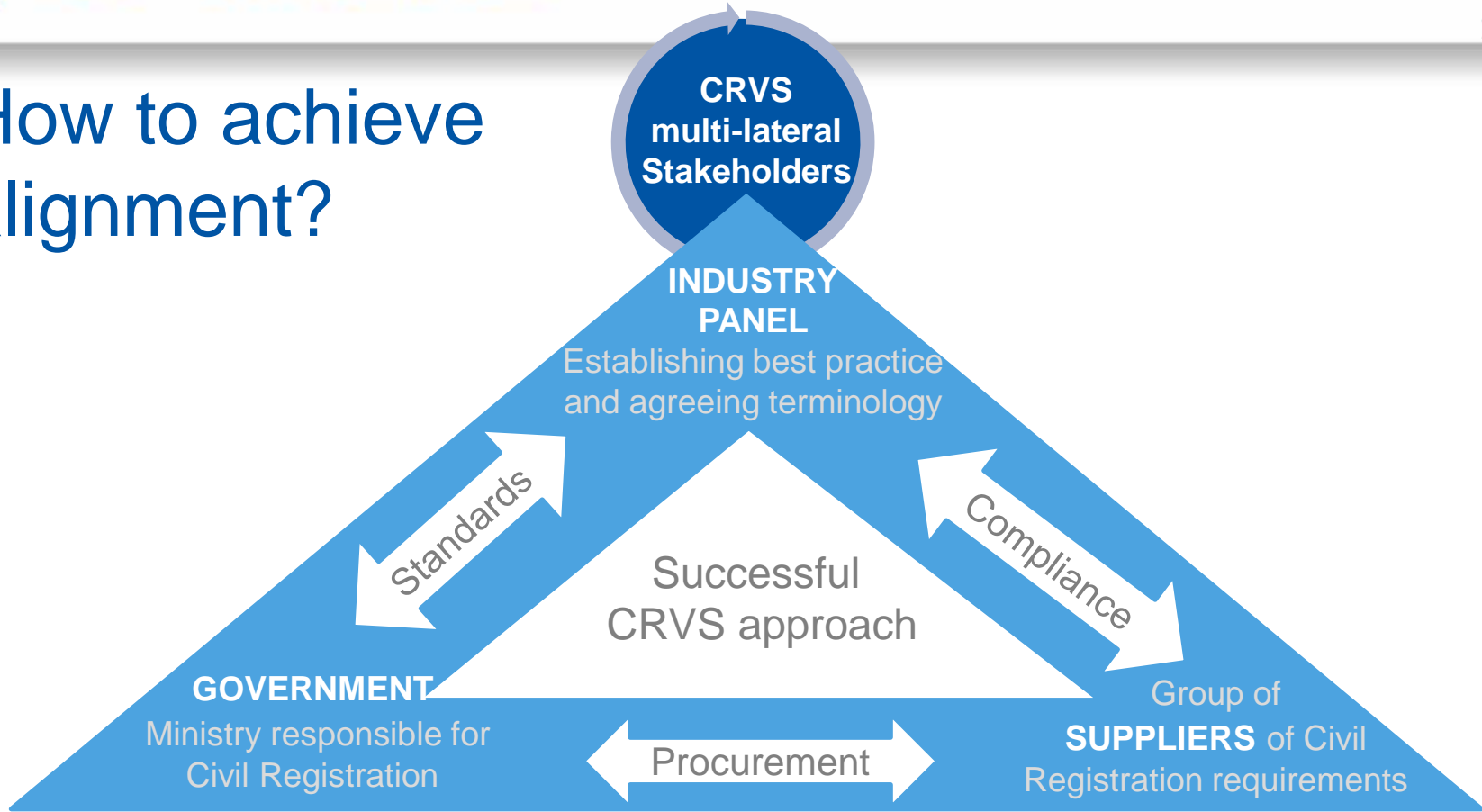
Engage with all stakeholders in countries

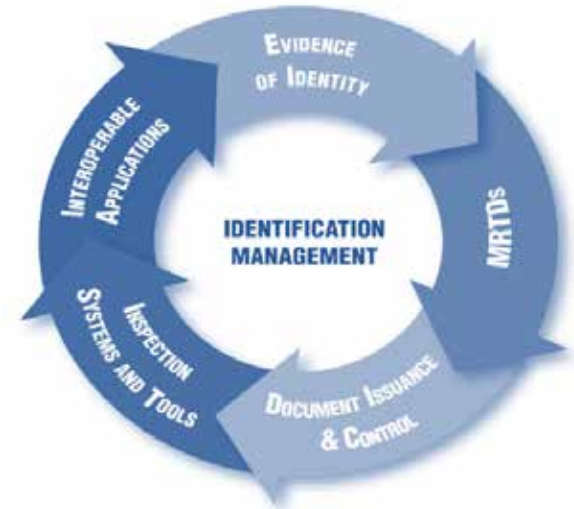
