IOSA Programme

Concept

- **Global programme**, built on ICAO standards and industry best practices;
- Internationally recognized and accepted evaluation system implemented consistently

Goal

- 7 Reduce Number of audits







Audit Model


One Audit per Airline (24-month interval)





Audit Sharing Model

Through Audit reports sharing





What are the IOSA Audit Standards?

- Approximately 900 published operational standards and recommended practices
- Focus: operational quality/safety management and oversight
- Applicable to audits only; not regulations
- Include requirements from ICAO, DoD; also industry best practices

Bottom line: A well managed airline will meet IOSA Standards

ORG - Organization & Management System

FLT – Flight Operations

DSP – Flight Dispatch

MNT – A/C Engineering & Maintenance

CAB – Cabin Operations

GRH – Ground Handling

CGO - Cargo Operations

SEC - Operational Security



Audits and Auditor Training

Who conducts them?

Audits	Auditor Training
→ Audit Organizations (AOs) accredited by IATA	Auditor training is conducted by:
-AOs must meet strict accreditation standards	-Endorsed Training Organizations (ETOs)
-Auditors must meet qualification and training standards	accredited by IATA
-Seven (7) AOs are currently accredited	-Three (3) ETOs are currently accredited.


Where does IOSA fit?



IATA Board decision

IATA as a Quality Association

- Any airline wanting to join IATA must first become IOSA Registered
- → All existing Members must:
 - Have committed to an IOSA audit by end 2006 (6 IATA members did not meet this deadline)
 - Carry out their IOSA audit by end 2007 (3 IATA members did not meet this deadline
 - Complete any corrective action and be registered by end 2008
 - Maintain IOSA Registration by being successfully audited biennially

7 Gap Analysis

Provide an assessment of the airline (7 done in 2005, 26 in 2006, 40 in 2007)

7 Implementation

- → IATA members in developing regions
 (Started in AFI, expanded into LATAM, Russia /CIS, MENA, Asia Pacific)
- → IATA financing plus matching funds
 - Pratt & Whitney sponsored 8 Safety Courses in 2006
 - Boeing financed 4 gaps in AFI in 2006

Helping Airlines in developing nations to meet IOSA

7 Mission

- Help Airlines close findings in due time
- Prepare for the renewal IOSA audits

→ Strategy

Apply differentiated assistance depending on the status of each airline

7 Implementation

- Continuous individual visits from IATA regional offices
- IOSA CARs closing courses offered on individual basis
- Specialised training courses depending on particular needs
- SMS workshops to teach how to build SMS and QMS system

Deliverables

- 7 IOSA CARs closing courses conducted in various locations (Thailand, Iran, Tanzania, South Africa, Azerbaijan, Malawi, Nigeria)
- 1 SMS Workshop conducted in Antigua
- 1 Course on Documentation course conducted in Algeria for regional airlines



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IOSA QA Programmes



Enhancing QA

IOSA QA

- A standardised global airline safety audit programme
- Airlines and other agencies (such as Regulators) use IOSA Audit Reports;
- 7 Feedback from AOs, airlines, and other programme participants is incorporated

Internal QA

- AO and ETO Accreditation;
- Control of the IOSA Registry and management of IOSA Audit Reports
- Standards and Change revision management;
- AO Master Auditor Lists;
- IAR Quality Control (QC) data management;

External QA

- → AOs IATA Staff plus airline representatives observing actual audit interviews
- AO and ETO HQ Audits
- AO Management of IAR's
- 7 ETO Training Course Observations

Benefits from IOSA

For Airlines & States

Airlines	States
→ Capability for safer operations	→ States can access IOSA Audit reports
→ Improved internal efficiency	-Enhance and focus their own oversight activities
→ Reduced number of audits	-Use IOSA in Foreign AOC
→ Codeshare and wet-lease opportunities	-Use IOSA in wet-lease determinations
	→ Some states are mandating IOSA
	-Turkey, Chile, Madagascar, Mexico, Brazil, Costa Rica, Panama
	-Other STATES



Extending IOSA

- Extending IOSA to the airline industry generally
 - → All-cargo operators now being audited
 - → Low Cost Carriers, Charters now being audited
 - Non-Members − now being audited
- → Other IOSA-style audits
 - → Ground Handlers ISAGO programme launch in 2008
 - → MROs programme under study
