Air Transport

- Safe, secure and sustainable activity
- Safest mode of transportation
- Efficient mode of transportation
- Provides economic and social benefits







Air Transport Facts (Source ATAG 2008)

- Some 2,000 airlines in the world operate a total fleet of 23,000 aircraft
- Serve some 3,750 airports through a route network of several million kilometres managed by around 160 air navigation service providers
- Air transport industry generates 32 million jobs globally, through direct, indirect, induced and catalytic impacts
- Aviation's global economic impact (direct, indirect, induced and catalytic) is estimated at USD 3,560 billion, equivalent to 7.5% of world Gross Domestic Product (GDP)

Air Transport Today

- 2010 rate of accidents on schedule flights was one of the lowest
- Jet aircraft are 70% more fuel efficient and quieter than those in the 1960s
- 2010: 2.5 billion passengers
- ICAO expects global air traffic to grow (pax-km performed)
 - 5.3% in 2011
 - 6.2% in 2012
 - 6.1% in 2013
- ICAO Safety Objective 2011-13 is to enhance global civil aviation safety



Global Accident Rate



2010 Pan America Accidents

- Number of accidents in 2010
 - 34.4% below 2009
 - 46.3% below the 10 year average
- Fatalities on board in 2010
 - 5.5% below 2009
 - 41.0% below the 10 year average
 - 9 of the 53 fatal accidents involved aircraft with maximum takeoff mass above 5,700 kg
 - 2 in Colombia, 1 in Cuba, 1 in Mexico, 1 in Suriname, 2 in the United States and 2 in Venezuela



Pan America Region Top Fatal Accident Categories




LOC-I Occurrences Distribution







CFIT Occurrences Distribution




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RE Ocurrences Distribution







Pan American Region Safety Challenge

- Need for improvement
 - Safety oversight, infrastructure, ANS, training, etc.
- ICAO and the industry in Pan American Region created:
 - The Regional Aviation Safety Group Pan America (RASG-PA)
- Align with the objectives of:
 - ICAO Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP)
 - ISSG Global Aviation Safety Roadmap (GASR)







Regional Aviation Safety Group – Pan America (RASG-PA)

- Established in November 2008
- NAM/CAR/SAM regional focal point for aviation safety
- Ensures harmonization and coordination of safety initiatives
- Avoid duplication of efforts
- Reduces the use of human and fiscal resources





RASG-PA Characteristics

- First initiative of its kind globally
- Regionalization of safety initiatives
- Combines experiences and resources of governments and industry
- Existence depends on participation commitment and members' contribution
- Recognize by ICAO





RASG-PA Safety Activities

- 2009: identified 3 top data-driven risk areas (fatalities) in NAM/CAR/SAM Regions:
 - 1. RE: Runway Excursion
 - 2. CFIT: Controlled Flight Into Terrain
 - 3. LOC-I: Lost of Control In-Flight
- 2010: recommended Safety Enhancement Initiatives (SEIs) to mitigate 3 top data-driven risk areas
- 2011: applying Detailed Implementation Plans (DIPs)



RASG-PA Safety Activities cont.



Aviation Safety events:

- 1st & 2nd Pan American Aviation Safety Summits: Brazil (2010), Mexico (2011)
- 1st & 2nd Aviation Safety Workshops: Mexico (2011), Venezuela (2011)

- 1. PA-RAST: Pan America Regional Aviation Safety Team
- 2. ASTT: Aviation Safety Training Team
- 3. ASRT: Annual Safety Report Team






PA-RAST Safety Enhancement Initiatives Methology



PA-RAST Regional Aviation Safety Team

Safety Enhancement Initiatives:

- Runway Excursions (RE) promote:
 - Pilot adherence to Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for approach procedures including the go-around decision making process
 - Specific training for pilots and air traffic controllers to avoid unstable approaches
 - Specific training for aerodrome personnel regarding maintenance and operations of the runway
 - Implementation of Runway Safety Teams (RSTs)

PA-RAST Regional Aviation Safety Team

Safety Enhancement Initiatives:

- Controlled Flight into Terrain (CFIT) promote:
 - Specific Approach and Landing Accident Reduction (ALAR/CFIT) training for pilots
 - Crew Resource Management (CRM) / Situational Awareness training for pilots and air traffic controllers

PA-RAST Regional Aviation Safety Team

Safety Enhancement Initiatives:

- Loss of Control In-Flight (LOC-I) promote:
 - LOC training: advanced maneuvers
 - LOC training: pilot monitoring policies and procedures for the operator and training program for flight crews





ASTT - Aviation Safety Training Team

- Compile aviation safety training material for the data driven risk areas to be available on RASG-PA website
- Encourage RASG-PA members to provide aviation safety training material as in-kind support to RASG-PA
- Deliver RASG-PA Aviation Safety Workshops




The Third Meeting of the Regional Aviation Safety Group - Pan America (RASG-PA/3) was held at the Moon Palace Hotel, Punta Cana, Dominican Republic, from 27 to 29 October 2010, hosted by the Civil Aviation Authority of Dominican Republic. The meeting was attended by 52 delegates from 14 States/Territories of the NAM/CAR/SAM Regions, 6 international organizations, 3 regional safety oversight organizations (RSOO), and 2 aircraft manufacturers.



2001-2010 Pan America Regional Safety Summary



- Top fatal accident categories are:
 - Loss of Control In-flight (LOC-I),
 - Runway Excursions (RE)
 - Controlled Flight into Terrain (CFIT)
- LOC-I & CFIT appear to have a decreasing trend
- System-component failure/malfunction (non-powerplant) (SCF-NP) and unknown (UNK) occurrences are emerging types of accidents/incidents
- SCF-NP occurrences show an increasing trend since 2005 usually not leading to fatal accidents
- Aircraft malfunction and maintenance events were noted threats identified among the top contributing factors for Pan American accidents in 2010





RASG-PA Future

- Need for financial and in-kind support
- Participation of high-level representatives at meetings and supporting projects
- Exchanging information, experiences and tools among members
- Strategic aviation safety forum for Pan America
- Maintaining contact with similar organizations worldwide
