1. WHAT IS PNR?



PNR is

the common name given to <u>records</u> created by aircraft operators or their authorized agents for <u>each</u> <u>journey</u> booked by or on behalf of any passenger. The data are used by operators . . . in providing air transportation services. PNR built up by data supplied for <u>all</u> segments of a passenger's journey.

1. WHY STATES WANT PNR DATA?



- improve clearance at border controls
- risk management purposes
- combat illegal migration
- identify passengers who are a known immigration or security threat
- more effective allocation of border control and law enforcement resources

1. WHY STATES WANT PNR DATA?



improve/enhance security (generally) & aviation security (in particular)

threat assessment value from analysis of data

fight against terrorism

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2. WHEN PNR DATA COLLECTED?



When is PNR data collected?

Captured months/ weeks/ days in advance of flight; systems of sales agents, airlines, other entities



What PNR data is collected?

106 (approx.) elements of data

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Annex 9: RP 3.48 on PNR data:

Contracting States requiring Passenger Name Record (PNR) access should conform their data requirements and their handling of such data to guidelines developed by ICAO.



→ Growing importance of PNR data transmission for aviation security purposes

→ Need for international uniformity

→ Doc 9944/PNRGOV: Guidelines

→ On-going work in FALP and other bodies



37th Assembly (2010) Resolutions

- Declaration on Aviation Security
 - ➤ States urged to use PNR as an aid to aviation security
- A37-20, Appendix D, Section III
 - ► States to ensure passenger data requirements conform to international standards adopted by UN agencies



High-Level Conference on Aviation Security (HLCAS, September 2012)

1. Conclusions:

- → <u>international standardization</u> in the use of . . . PNR . . .would contribute to the <u>operational and economic viability</u> of the air transport industry;
- → a <u>lack of harmonization</u> in . . . PNR . . can <u>reduce the effectiveness</u> of utilizing such data for the purposes for which it is required;
- → it is essential that States <u>standardize their data requirements</u> and <u>adopt a standard format</u> for the electronic transmission of passenger data;
- → ICAO and Member States should promote and enhance the global harmonization of PNR systems;
- → States should, in the use of passenger data as an aid to security, ensure the protection of passengers' privacy.



2. Recommendations:

- → States <u>align</u> the various data exchange systems . . . with the international data transmission <u>standards adopted by relevant United Nations</u> agencies . . .;
- → ICAO incorporate <u>new SARPs into Annex 9</u> with the objective of enhancing global standardization on passenger data transmission and safeguarding the economic sustainability of international air transport; [▶]
- → PNR systems, <u>based on the PNRGOV message format</u>, require only those data elements collected and stored in aircraft operator systems, as described in *Guidelines on Passenger Name Record (PNR) Data* (Doc 9944), to meet the business and operational needs of those aircraft operators;
- → ICAO provide States with <u>assistance and training</u> on the implementation of . . . PNR . . .



FALP/7 Meeting (October 2012)

→ 3.48 Amended: <u>Specific reference</u> to 9944 & PNRGOV message implementation guidance

→ (new 3.48.1): States & Operators: provide 24/7 support

→ (new 3.48.2): When requiring PNR data, States should consider the <u>adoption and implementation</u> of the <u>PNRGOV message</u> as a method of transferral of PNR data.
