# 1. Introduction

1.1 Training is a core element for human development and performance, and a key element for all phases of aeronautical activities planning, implementation, operations and improvements.

- 1.2 Civil Aviation Training Centres (CATC) are an essential part of this training structure. Considering the needs in the NAM/CAR Regions and the update of the Regional Training Plan, the NAM/CAR Regions CATCs requested ICAO to convene the First NAM/CAR Civil Aviation Training Centres Meeting (NAM/CAR/CATC/1) at the ICAO NACC Regional Office, Mexico City, Mexico, which was held from 27 to 30 August 2013.
- 1.3 In accordance with ICAO Assembly Resolution A38-12, Appendix D, ICAO shall assist and advise training facility operators and Member States with achieving and maintaining competency of aviation personnel through the ICAO Aviation Training Programme (IATP). The IATP shall be governed by the following principles:
  - a) Qualification of aviation professionals is the responsibility of Member States
  - b) The highest priority is placed on learning activities that support the implementation of SARPs
  - c) Cooperation with Member States and industry is essential to develop and implement learning activities to support the implementation of SARPs
  - d) Priority shall be placed on cultivating the next generation of aviation professionals.

# 2. Discussion

- 2.1 NAM/CAR/CATC/WG activities dependent upon the participation of its members in order to continue to provide the framework from which regional, and national implementation plans will be developed and implemented in the NAM/CAR Regions.
- 2.2 At the NACC/DCA/5 Meeting, the Directors of Civil Aviation formulated the following Conclusion:

# CONCLUSION NACC/DCA/5/9

# ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CIVIL AVIATION TRAINING CENTRES WORKING GROUP (NAM/CAR/CATC/WG)

That, in order to improve and coordinate training to benefit aviation development in the NAM/CAR Regions with participation of users and training service providers:

- a) the establishment of the NAM/CAR/CATC/WG is hereby approved along with its Terms of Reference (ToRs) and Work Programme as presented in the Appendix to WP/14; and
- b) the development of a survey to determine the regional training needs for 2015-2016 is approved.

- 2.3 Given the importance of training of personnel involved in the various areas of civil aviation, the dynamic and constantly changing processes and systems to meet growing demands and subsequent technological innovations, the ICAO NACC Office will conduct a survey of needs and training capabilities at the regional level.
- 2.4 With this information it will be possible to know directly from the States, in which specific issues they need to train aviation personnel, as well as explore the possibilities that can be provided by States through their respective training centres controlled by the aeronautical authorities.
- 2.5 This inventory of training needs and training centres, will be implemented annually, and will be assessed by the training centres and ICAO NACC Office to determine what kind of courses would need to be implemented to meet the demand based on needs expressed by the States.

#### 3. Conclusion

- 3.1 According to the training needs expressed by Member States on the one hand, and the training offered by training centres on the other hand, we can infer that the needs are not covered entirely.
- 3.2 Therefore, it requires that the expectations or the contents of the courses requested by States, may differ or vary from the program and content of the courses offered. So it is important to clarify the scope of the required courses and know in detail the programs that are offered.

# 4. Action by the Meeting

- 4.1 The Meeting is invited to:
  - a) take note of the efforts presented in this working paper to improve training and competencies of technical aviation personnel;
  - b) approve the proposed Aviation Training Questionnaires as presented in **Appendixes A** and **B** to this working paper;
  - b) recommend other appropriate actions.
