ICAO Security Culture Website



ICAO is incredibly grateful that the international aviation community have provided material for the [ICAO Security Culture website](#). Stakeholders have shared security culture videos, pamphlets, posters, and articles to underline the importance of developing an effective security culture in aviation. Best practices and guidance material have also been posted, aiming to inspire the aviation community to implement a strong security culture. The website will be maintained as a permanent ICAO resource.

ICAO Security Culture Training



Security culture is a central component of ICAO assistance and training and this will continue in 2022. The ICAO [Security Culture Workshop](#) was launched in 2021 and was delivered on 10 occasions to 131 students from 29 States.

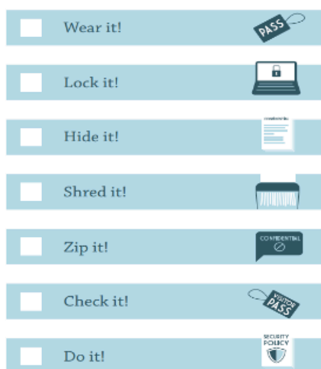
The workshop is based on existing ICAO tools and resources in



establishing and maintaining good security behaviours. This includes the **ICAO Security Culture Toolkit** and the **ICAO Security Culture Campaign ‘Starter Pack’** – both available to download, free of charge, from the [ICAO Security Culture website](#) in all ICAO languages.

AVSEC2021: Security Culture Outcomes

The [ICAO Global Aviation Security Symposium 2021](#) took place virtually 8-10 September 2021. The Symposium highlighted the challenges civil aviation must overcome as it continues to be impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. There was a focus on “*Empowering Human Resources to Support Recovery*”, where new tools to enhance staff competencies were highlighted, with panellists sharing training best practices to strengthen the security posture and security culture of staff. There was also a focus on the importance of human factors and [human performance](#) in aviation to maintain appropriate security levels. The integral event is available for viewing on [ICAO TV](#).
