## Agenda Item 6:Aeronautical Surveillance

Draft IATA policy on automatic dependent surveillance – broadcast (ADS-B) OUT

## (Presented by IATA)

- 1. IATA is developing a policy statement on ADS-B OUT, which should be approved by 1 June 2007. The policy will be made available to airlines, States, ICAO and other aviation partners.
- 2. Though at this time the statement is being reviewed, certain elements will remain I the final policy.
- 3. The IATA position is:

Where justified by operational and business cases, ground-based surveillance should migrate towards ADS-B OUT, and new surveillance implementations should consider ADS-B OUT in airports and continental airspaces;

- 4. IATA supports:
  - a) the global implementation of Mode S 1090 MHz Extended Squitter (1090ES) ADS-B OUT standard for the provision of radar-like service by ATS Providers;
  - b) expeditious implementation of ADS-B OUT;
  - c) the concept that all new systems requiring to interact with aircraft transponders should be interoperable with 1090ES;
  - d) ATS ground systems that will recognize and provide safety and efficiency benefits to RTCA DO 260 A transponders and to early equippers of DO-260 transponders.

#### Action by the meeting

The meeting is invited to take note of the draft IATA ADS-B OUT policy, and propose the establishment of a Task Force composed of ATM and CNS experts to develop an AFI ADS-B implementation plan.

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
